If you log into the ClubRunner program, you can edit your Rotary profile, check member lists, send emails and find much more information about our club.



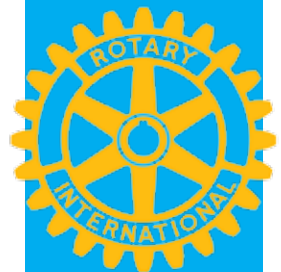

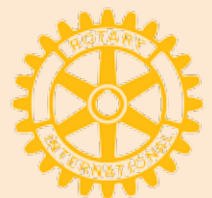
Moira Kerr thanked our speakers.
