This week, our guest speaker was Margaret Campbell. Margaret was introduced by Julia Smith, our pianist, who told us, among other things, that Margaret is a member of the Sunrise Rotary Club.

Margaret is the daughter of Richard and Lois Pierce who are well known to long-time Rotarians. Lois was a local doctor and Richard was the chief administrator of General Hospital in Chatham. Richard was also president of our club. In 1970, her parents decided to walk across Canada to raise money for the Rotary Foundation. The trek took 9 months.

Margaret and her late husband Dave have worked for years helping people in Belarus recover from the Chernobyl nuclear accident. She has been raising money for 15 years through the group Canadian Aid for Chernobyl.

This area is now radioactive and will be for centuries. Although the land grows food, the food is also radioactive and can not be eaten or sold.

Over the years, Margaret has raised funds to install running water in several households. This required supplying the kitchen counter and taps as well.

Margaret and her husband also build greenhouses, chicken barns and helped to feed the kids at a local orphanage.

For many years, children from this area were hosted by Canadians and other countries in the summer. This allowed the children to be away from the radioactivity for a time. They received health care, including dentistry, while here. For political reasons, this program has stopped.



Margaret showed pictures of the inside of the small houses where many people live together with minimal heating and food. Margaret has lived with one local family in one of these tiny houses. The family speak Russian and Margaret can only talk to this family when a translator is available.

The local currency is devalued regularly and this traps the locals in poverty. They can not afford to leave and it is not safe for them to stay.

We appreciate the sacrifices that Margaret is making to help the people in Belarus. She is changing lives.
