Our guest speaker was Dr. Indraneel Ghosh our Chair of Emergency Medicine and Senior Director of Strategy Access and Flow talking about understanding emergency services: an evidence based rationale for change to improve quality care for all in Chatham-Kent

Dr. Ghosh is a graduate of University of Toronto, Queens & McMaster University and currently works at the Chatham-Kent Health Alliance

Dr. Ghosh is a self-professed leadership nerd, he is fascinated by leaders and has always wanted to work in places where he believes in the leadership. Sometime ago he became disillusioned by the leadership at his place of work and was then recruited to come to Chatham-Kent. The primary reason he chose to come to CK was because of the Senior Team in place at CKHA. It has inspired him to become a leader again.

What is emergency medicine? A medical specialty that is dedicated to diagnosing and treating of unforeseen illness or injury. An individual working in emergency medicine has to have a passion for this because the variety of illnesses and injuries and the number of patients varies from day to day. The key with emergency medicine is the co-ordination of care required once the patient has been admitted. It's not just about the care they receive at the time they arrive but continues with the care they may need after initial diagnosis.

CKHA uses the Canadian Triage Acuity score and the ABC's of emergency care (Airway, Breathing, and Circulation) to evaluate patients as they come into the emergency room. True emergency care is for those people who require Resuscitation and Emergent care. Patients who present with these symptoms need immediate care. The primary focus of emergency rooms is and should be critically ill patients. These patients require a high degree of skill, training and expertise. Dr. Ghosh stressed that critically ill people have a better outcome when they are taken care of in a setting where critically ill patients are routinely treated by a team of clinicians that have specialized training and regular exposure to these situations.

Dr. Ghosh discussed pre-hospital to hospital care ie. the care provided by our EMS. Their objective is always to provide the best care for every patient every time. That safety, quality and access drive the two key principles of:

Volume drives quality

Backup specialized care is essential

Again the objective is to have the best care for every patient every time.

Statistics were provided that demonstrate that the patient load in Chatham is significantly higher than that of the Sydenham Campus 45,000 vs 17,000 patients. Using the principles of ABC the statistics were drilled down further to demonstrate that the number of critical, true emergency care patients per month are:

	Chatham	Sydenham
Resuscitation	38.5	11
Intubation	7.3	1.6
TNK administration ⁴		0.6

Dr. Ghosh stressed again that volume directs quality. In Wallaceburg there are no specialized backups available such as aestheticians, no team of experienced and trained specialists to support the emergency room doctor.

There is among the Clinicians an agreement that consolidation of care in one site is the best course of action.

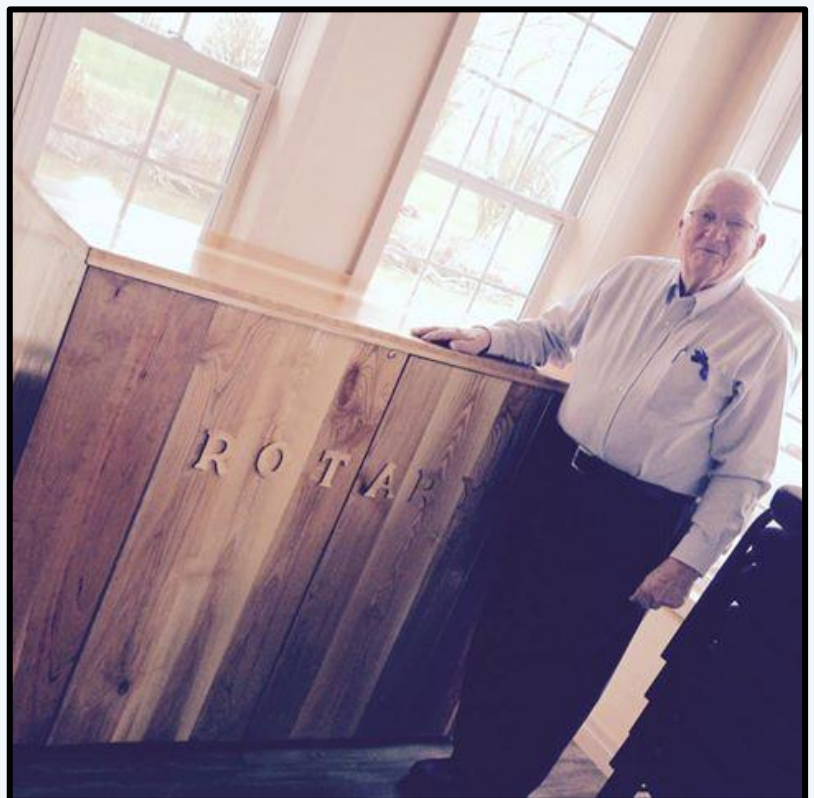

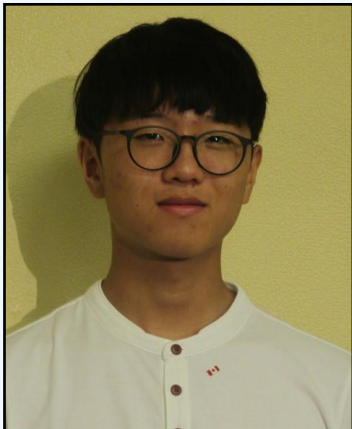

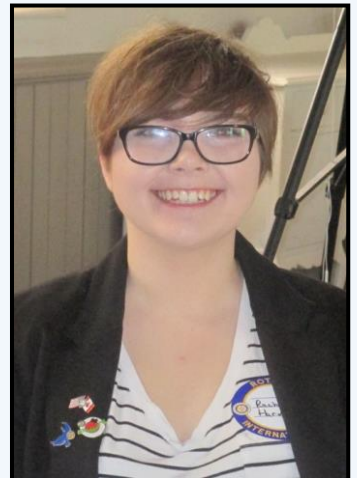
