

Rotarian Brett Smith introduced Ken Bell, our guest speaker this week. Ken is a resident of Chatham-Kent and is a very enthusiastic volunteer who is dedicated to the local environment. In 2005, he was part of a 5-year project to monitor the water quality of Rondeau Bay. With a group of students who took water samples, the group monitored the water quality in the rivers and streams of this area and the impact on local fish. The data was later given to the Lower Thames Valley Conservation Authority. Ken also talked about the Shrewsbury and Raglan Assembly, a local initiative of Shrewsbury citizens. In 1965, 12 local people, both Canadian and American, decided to save the local school and turn it into a community centre. They promoted local projects with the goal of cooperative and friendly cultivating relationship among the residents. The original group ran the 4 acre facility for about 25 years. As the original volunteers aged or moved away, it became difficult to maintain enthusiasm for the project. By 2011, the community centre was being sold for overdue taxes. At that point, Ken and a few volunteers started fund-raising. In 2013, they held the first maple syrup festival and the first blues



festival. Both of these events raised much needed funds and the events are still continuing today. The money raised has been used to pay off the overdue taxes, build a pole barn, buy a lawnmower and sponsor other events. Recently 66 trees were added to the property. The Rotary Club is always pleased to hear about local service projects involving concerned volunteers and we thank Ken for telling us about the Shrewsbury and Raglan Assembly. Our thanks were expressed by **Rotarian Charles Seaman.**

The Chatham-Kent Local **Immigration** Partnership was the topic of this week's guest speaker. Victoria Bodnar. Victoria was introduced by Rotarian Tania Sharpe. The Local Immigration Partnership, known as LIP, brings together community resources to help newcomers benefit from local support programs. The local LIP was started in 2010 to identify needs of immigrants and find solutions to these needs. Chatham-Kent had a population of 104,075 in 2011, a drop of 4.2% from 2006. There are over 8,000 immigrants in CK with the largest group falling in the 15 to 44 years old group. Another 2,000 temporary foreign workers are estimated to be in Chatham-Kent. LIP hopes to foster a welcoming community and help integrate these newcomers into our midst. About 10% of the local population are in this group and we would like to celebrate the diversity they



bring to our area. The local LIP has lots to partners to support their initiatives. in particular the need for proper health care. A CK Welcome Network has recently been launched make this area

more welcoming. With a shrinking population, CK hopes to attract more people, particularly in the young adult age group. This information is very topical and **Rotarian Tony Hill** expressed the thanks of the club to Victoria for her presentation.
