Petite Maman Official Selection TIFF 2021

This film from Director Céline Sciamma (Portrait of a Lady on Fire) is a tender tale of intergenerational connection. After her grandmother dies, Nelly is taken to her mother's childhood home. While her parents clear the house, Nelly explores the surrounding woods encountering Marion, a girl exactly Nelly's age and to whom she bears a striking resemblance. Incrementally, the girls' eerie similarities yield revelations that merge events of the past with those of the present. Sciamma brings her acute insights into longing to bear on a tale of childhood grief and wonder. This is a film of tremendous tenderness and sombre beauty and draws lovely, subtle performances from the film's young stars.
