History





Monoculture (pristine green) lawns
mean less biodiversity
maintained using chemicals (fertilizers) that leach into ecosystems, our homes, rivers and lakes, killing biodiversity

Research

shows environmental, economic and health benefits from mowing less and by moving away from monoculture lawns and developing naturalised gardens.





An economic case study of the mowing costs in Trois-Rivières, Canada, suggests that cost savings of 36% may be possible with a modest reduction of mowing frequency.


Ultimately and ideally we hope to inspire property owners and managers to create more meadow - native flowering gardens, more trees – little forests and edible forests.

When it is time to cut grass, cut it in stages: do not go from *No Mow* back to the old short lawn in one cut. Grass should not be cut more than a third of its length as cutting any lower could kill your grass.

Please save your signs and put them up again in April next year, or if you have switched to a meadow, pollinator, edible or forest garden inspire a friend or neighbor to use the sign!









Migrating Birds in May & Fall
Birds biodiversity

LOSSES AMONG BIRDS BY FAMILY











Birds disoriented by lights can circle structures for extended periods of time, leading to exhaustion or accelerated use of energy stores critical for migration. Birds attracted to lights on buildings and structures frequently crash into windows and collide into buildings, unfortunately ending in tragedy
