Ribfest Sponsors Ceremony

Peter Dusek – Ribfest Photo Presentation



Peter Dusek presented a collection of his "amazing" pictures that he took during the 2014 Toronto Ribfest. They chronicle the activities from the set-up days through the 5 days of Ribfest and end with the fireworks on Canada Day. Peter took pictures from all perspectives including from high on a "cherry picker" to standing behind the ribbers as they cooked and served their customers. He captured the personalities of staff, the volunteers, the ribbers, the food judges, the vendors, the entertainers and the public. He also took great pictures of the Citizenship ceremony on Canada Day and captured the emotion of the people who were becoming Canadian Citizens. Peter's pictures can been seen on his website <u>www.peterdusek.com</u> President Mark said that the purpose of today's luncheon is to thank our sponsors who are an important part in the Toronto Ribfest. While we rely heavily on our volunteers, "at the end of the day our Ribfest sponsors play a very large part in our Club's success". The funds we raise at Ribfest not only go to "improving our local community but also to help the global community". Mark thanked the sponsors for helping the "community we touch".



Mark wanted to explain Rotary's "Four Avenues of Service" to the sponsors. The avenues of service are; Community; International; Vocational; and Youth Services. Community Service is the largest "outreach" with 60% of the money we raise at Ribfest going directly back into the community in a wide range of places. This includes the \$300,000 rebuilding and retrofit of a community centre in the Islington/Dixon neighbourhood that we are sponsoring in conjunction with the Toronto West Rotary Club. This centre is helping to empower young entrepreneurs, helping young women, and many other at risk youth related services. Our Club also has a "hands on" volunteer group that recently



packed 144 school backpacks and distributed them to local community centres and to disadvantaged youth. Our Club also participated in a food packing event where 14,200 meal packs were created and distributed to various organizations. Rotary's International focus includes clean water, sanitation and education. Rotary's main international focus has been on the eradication of Polio. Rotary's goal is that by 2018 we can all say that "Polio has been eradicated once and for all". Mark thanked the sponsors for being a part of this. Our Vocational Services are "work related" such as creating work opportunities for the disabled. Our Club is also acting as a "sounding board" for entrepreneurs where they can "bounce ideas" of our committee to try and improve their businesses. There may also be opportunities for mentoring. One of the major things that Youth Services does in our Club is Camp Enterprise where high school students have to design and promote a "fundraising event". The Club then gives the winning group "seed" money to carry out the event. It may also lead to the creation of "new Rotarians. As well, since 2003 the Club has donated \$40,000 in student awards to 60 students. All this and more is what our Club does with the money we raise at Ribfest. Mark wanted to again thank are sponsors for being a big part of it.

Enigma Research (an independent research group) canvassed our Ribfest attendees and found:

There were 165,000 visits to Ribfest of which 100,625 were "unique" visitors.

- 76% enjoy learning about new products and services when visiting events.
- 53% are loyal to brands that make meaningful contributions to their favourite events.
