Dona has been "In Service" all of her life:

- She was a Trustee of the Board of Education in 1988
- She became Chair of TDSB in 2002
- She turned to Provincial Politics in 2003 and retired as MPP in May 2014
- During her time in the Legislature, she held Ministerial positions I; Natural Resources; Transportation; and Energy
- She has served on numerous Boards of Community-related activities and has chaired many
- In 2012, our Club recognized Donna's dedicated service to the community with the Honorary Paul Harris Award

Jack presented Donna with her President's lapel pin and officially welcomed her as President.



Donna thanked Jack for his warm welcome and noted the she accepted the nomination for the Presidency because or the "extraordinary people to work with, and she knows "who to call on for any assistance or advice". Our Club is like "family". The Rotary motto is "Service Above Self" and our members embody it and "know how to walk the walk". Our members are "very much her kind of people".

He also wanted to thank her husband Bill, who for 49 years has been her "stalwart". She also has her "dear friend" Jack to "lean on".

Donna is looking doing "some interesting and different" things at our meetings this year. One thing is, she is planning to hold an International Women's Day event this year.

Donna wanted to thank the membership for "the confidence they have placed in her to take on the role of President". She also is looking to get the help of "each and every" member of the Club through the year.



Donna also wanted to recognize one of our members that we are "losing as a member of the Board of Directors this year", Kester Trim. Donna said that when she joined the Board, she was "extraordinarily impressed with Kester" and that he was an "extraordinary Chair of the Community Service Committee. His dedication and eye for organization is "filtering through to the other committees" which is making things much organized. Donna said that Kester "spoke from the heart" and "made a difference". He will be "missed dearly" by the Board.

## Jack Fleming - Remarks as the Chair of Toronto Ribfest 2017

  - Hopefully, your actions will serve to inspire other members to step up in a greater way going forward

Michael noted that he joined Rotary "4 to 5 years ago". Andre Dugas "recruited" him at a Ribfest. He also talked with Michael Bell, and the rest is history.

He added that Justin DiCiano "lied to him" when he told Michael "how easy it was to run stores Ribfest". However, he is happy to see the way that stores has evolved and grown under his oversight.
