ROTARY CLUB OF ETOBICOKE CAMP ENTERPRISE CODE OF CONDUCT

The Rotary International Four-Way Test: Of the things we think, say or do:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOOD WILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

The Directors and staff of the Rotary Club of Etobicoke's Camp Enterprise and the Manager and staff of the University of Toronto at Mississauga want your time at camp to be filled with exciting experiences, new friendships and fun. For this to happen, campers are expected to be considerate of others, participate fully in the camp program, observe the camp code of conduct and respect camp facilities.

In order to help us assure your safety and well being, certain policies have been developed. We trust that once you understand these policies, you'll agree that they are reasonable and you will follow them. Basically, it boils down to this: if you respect the law, camp property, and the rights of other campers, we'll all get along and have a great time.

The Camp reserves the right, upon notification of parents, to dismiss any student for improper dress, conduct, language, or attitude which, in the judgment of the administrative or counseling staff, is deemed detrimental to the other students or smooth operation of the camp. The dismissed youth will contact parent or guardian who will be responsible for transportation from camp at their own expense.

- 1. Campers may not possess, use, distribute, or sell alcoholic beverages, drugs, firearms, weapons of any kind or fireworks.
- 2. Campers may not interfere with any security or fire system or tamper with locks in student rooms and other areas.
- Campers must not participate in vandalism and or pranks because of the potential danger to others and to camp property.
- 4. Under no circumstances are boys allowed to visit girls' rooms or vice-versa. Your counselor or another counselor of the same gender may check your room at any time. Pursuing romantic relationships will not be accepted or tolerated.
- 5. Campers will respect the privacy of others.
- Campers will not use offensive speech or actions that undermine camp decorum. Campers will not harass anyone verbally or physically.
- 7. Campers must obtain permission of the Camp Director before leaving camp premises for any reason.
- 8. Campers will deposit all litter only in containers provided. Recycle all glass, paper and cans in the proper containers.
- 9. Campers must attend all learning sessions and other scheduled camp activities. Campers are to be on-time and respectful during these sessions and/or activities.
- 10. Campers may use pay phones or in emergencies, may work with the camp staff to contact parents/relatives. Campers may not use cell phones during any camp activities.
- 11. Campers will not bring radios, tape or CD players, or TVs to camp with the exception of portable music players with earphones which will be allowed only at designated times and places. No earphones may be worn during camp activities.

These policies are extremely important and any infraction could lead to a camper's immediate expulsion.

We assure the management of our full cooperation and will ensure that our child is true to his/her word when it comes to living by the Camp Code of Conduct. I have read the Camp Code of Conduct and promise to abide by it.
