Ribfest Sponsors Recognition



President Hugh began by playing a video which shows how the Club promoted our sponsors at Ribfest followed by the 30 second commercial for Ribfest that played on CP24. Hugh also showed a video of the song written by Freddy Will for Ribfest (available on iTunes for \$0.99)

Hugh turned the ceremonies over to Ribfest Chair Michael Bell. Michael began by thanking everyone who attended today's luncheon and said it was "a great turnout". He especially wanted to thank all of the sponsors, the members of the Ribfest Committee, and all of our Clubs members involved for "all the work you have done to make another successful Ribfest. We can't do it without you".

Michael began handing out certificates to the sponsors in attendance.

The first went to Donna Winter and Gloria Peters from the City of Toronto.

Michael asked Justin DiCiano to accept the certificate on behalf of Dunpar who were always available when a back-hoe or extra golf cart was needed. Justin would just call his brother Julian and it would be done.



Michael wanted to recognize one of our vendors, Al and Ginette Southern from Hearts delight, who have also become one of our "great sponsors".

One of our new sponsors, Mike Walmsley from iMike was recruited by President Hugh. Mike designed many of our Ribfest signs, etc

Michael said the next certificate was special to him as it went to a quiet and unassuming person who was always there to bail us out. He had an answer to every question and was able to solve just about anything. He was the "back bone" of the organization and even made warehouse space available to store gear from

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the Ribfest trailer. Michael presented the certificate to our member Gerald Lue.



Michael noted that we used to be a "big club with a little Ribfest. Now we are a small club with a big Ribfest". However when we have problems "things always seem to fall into place". Sometimes you don't even have to ask for solutions. Mary Anne Viguilla is a student at Ryerson who needed who needed some volunteer time. Michael said he is not sure why she picked us but she became C.J.'s assistant and jumped in to help where she was needed. She did a great job and Michael wanted to present her with a certificate to recognize all the hard work she did.

Michael presented a certificate to Darron Armstrong from Modulock who provided the fencing for the Ribfest site.

Every year at Ribfest, the St. John's Ambulance has been on site to provide first aid. These are all volunteers and Michael wanted to thank them for their participation by giving a certificate to Brook Griffiths, one of their volunteers.

A special thank you Michael wanted to extend was to our former member and Past-President Ed Torres from Skywords. Ed has always provided a "helping hand" in many ways to Ribfest over the years including getting our commercials run. He is an organizer for the "Calabogie Bluesfest" and Michael and Ed have been "trading ideas" on how to do things and how to promote the events. Ed had an idea about using a PSA (public service

announcement) to get volunteers and still promote the event. It was too early to actually put out promos for the event, but he put out PSA's looking for volunteers for the event. This still puts the event in peoples' minds. Michael thought that this might be something we could look into. Michael added that Ed was kind enough to even rent our entrance structure from Ribfest for the Bluesfest. Michael was happy to present an appreciation certificate to Ed.



Michael now wanted to recognize the people responsible for our media advertising for Ribfest (make a story of Ribfest). Terrance Brouse (who wasn't able to be here today) and Kevin Morrison handled that task. Through their efforts and expertise the story of Ribfest was spread through the media. Last year we received 28 million tier 1 impressions. This year that rose to 44 million tier one impression were received about Ribfest, Rotary and what we are doing. There was an additional 5 million impression from Skywords. This means a lot of people heard about Ribfest. Michael presented a certificate to Kevin Morrison.

Michael asked Justin DiCiano to present the next certificate to Will Harris from Molson's. Justin said that since he has been involved in Ribfest over the past couple years, Molson's has been one of our beer vendors. He can't express how helpful they have been. He said they have called him at midnight asking if they need help emptying out the beer trailer and

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within half an hour they would be there helping out. They have given us "fantastic support" and Justin was happy to present Will Harris with his certificate.



Michael had a couple more awards top pass out. He held up a trophy with a pig on it. He said this award began last year and is called the "Saving Our Bacon" award. It is for someone that "comes out of the woodwork" to Al Neilson is from the help at Ribfest. Scarborough Rotary Club and is one of the organizers of the Scarborough Ribfest. He contacted Michael and asked "can I help out with your Ribfest?" Michael quickly said yes but thinks that Al may not have foreseen what was in store for him. Al worked 14 to 18 hour days doing everything from helping with electrical problems to anything else that had to be done. He did this willingly and never complained. Everyone considered Al a "heck of a great guy". Michael was happy to present him with the trophy.

The last award was new for this year. It is the "Heart of Ribfest" award. It goes to someone who is "hooked on Ribfest". Michael explained that Ribfest has a way of getting into your blood. Even though it takes up more and more of your time, you remain hooked. This year the Club hired a Coordinator for Ribfest. We were fortunate that person was C.J. Augustine-Kanu. C.J. did an amazing job, but Michael said that she also got "bitten by the Ribfest bug". It became a "labour of love" for her even though she spent "hours and hours" at Ribfest. It was a great please for Michael to present C.J. with

the award. C.J. wanted to say a few words. She said she had a "fantastic time" and is nice to see the "back-side of the Ribfest". It was a lot of work, but it was exciting. She said she enjoyed working with each and every one of our members. She will see what happens in 2013.

Michael closed by saying thank you again to his Ribfest Committee for all their hard work over the past year, to all the members who helped out and to all of our sponsors, etc.
