Maureen Bird - RI President Tanaka's Visit to the Toronto Rotary Club (Friday, March 1st) and Trump Aids Poker Walk (Saturday, April 27th)

Maureen Bird is a member of the Rotary Club of Toronto. She was here today to talk about the upcoming visit of RI President Sakuji Tanaka to the Toronto Club on March 1st. Maureen noted that when the President of the United States visits it is a "state visit". When the Queen visits it is a "state visit". When the RI President comes to visit a club it is also like a "state visit". This will be President Tanaka's

only visit to a club meeting in Canada. His visit is part of the Toronto Rotary Club's 100th Anniversary celebrations. During their centennial year the club is donating a total of \$1 million to various charities they support. They are making 11 donations of \$100,000 to charities selected by each of the club's committees. They have been doing a donation a month at a special luncheon. The next donation will be on February 8th when the Community Services committee makes a donation to Seaton House. On March 1st a cheque for \$100,000 to PolioPlus will be presented to President Tanaka. The \$100,000 donation will be matched by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. The donation will also be matched by the Canadian Government. The end Polio campaign is "almost there" though there still needs to be an effort made in the 3 remaining countries. Maureen is hoping that as many people as possible can attend. Tickets are \$80 and they are going fast. If you are interested in attending visit www.rotarytoronto.com to order tickets.

Maureen also wanted to mention the 4th Trump Aids Poker Walk on April 27th. Maureen noted that our club has been involved in the past and is hoping that we can a part of it again this year. She said that there is still 33 million people worldwide suffering from HIV Aids (50% are women). Maureen gave Nigel a sign-up sheet for anyone interested in becoming part of the team.
