<u>Speaker – Bob Jarvest</u>

Clive Waugh introduced our speaker, Bob Jarvest. Bob shared an overview of the important work done in the Dominican Republic during Jan/Feb/Mar 2018. Those being helped mostly include Haitians who are in the Dominican countryside working as labourers in the sugar cane fields. Highlights of his good work (and that of his team) included:

- 40 water filters installed, new owners educated and other units serviced
- 45 solar panel lighting systems installed and others serviced
- A new swing set installed in a school
- 8 concrete floors installed and some other homes provide with new mattresses, new roofs, etc.
- 225 bags of food (rice, oats, salt, fish, tomato paste, spaghetti, sugar, milk powder, etc.) distributed
- Sanitary kits for young, school-aged girls
- Clothes distributed
- Wheelchairs provided

- Students sponsored for post-secondary education, as well as transportation and food costs.
- Used laptops donated
- Other special projects, as requested
- Bob has requested a District Grant for \$5K to install 5 latrines on his next trip.

Kennisha Dyer thanked Bob for the good work he does and for sharing it with us.
