Welcoming Streets - Oshawa

Mayor Dan Carter introduced Jeff. They have known each other for 20 years and Mayor Dan praised Jeff for his extraordinary talent and leadership. This scribe was so impressed with the talk that I forgot a lot of it – thankfully Jeff shared his Powerpoint slides - so here are some of the highlights.

- Welcoming Streets is a partnership with Carea Community Health (Where Jeff is Manager), City of Oshawa, and Downtown BIA.
- Modelled after similar program in Guelf with modifications to support Oshawa's vulnerable community.
- The aim of the project is to foster a safe, inclusive and welcoming environment for all by supporting downtown business owners and assisting community members in need of assistance.
- A community-based outreach worker & health promoter serve as point of 1st contact.
- When are they called? Some of the key areas are:
 - Person in distress Services for unsheltered individuals Safety concerns Drug Paraphernalia retrieval Heat & cold alerts

Results so far show their initiative is working. Since Nov. 2019, they've had over 2700 client interactions, almost 100 calls for support, and almost 300 people participating in the varying education programs. They have also had 452 referrals to legal aid, harm reduction services, personal care needs, housing security, and counselling. They also distribute Outreach supplies that include snack packs, water bottles, hygiene kits, socks & underwear, blankets, backpacks, & COVID PPE.
