She has eaten her way through much of the free world, and since 1979 writes about it in books, newspapers and magazines. With four best-selling cookbooks and restaurant guides

to her credit, daily food columnist for 2 years at the Toronto Star, restaurant critic at the Toronto Sunday Sun for 25 years, a weekly, international Dining Out columnist at the Financial Post and National Post for 10 years; freelance writer at The Globe and Mail; 6 years as contributing editor at Flare, enRoute, Elle magazines, 16 years at Fodors Travel Guides. Lori Brazier spoke to the Robin Hood Army event on August 25th with another planned for October 20th. Sonya Thompson announced the renewal of Friendship Day on September 8th, information available on the Oshawa clubs' website.

Saleem Kassum, a ShelterBox Ambassador, introduced our speaker, current ED of ShelterBox Canada. Stephanie Christensen has been at the helm since February 2014. She spoke of the over 19 million affected by natural disasters and over 65 million who are currently displaced by conflict. Since its founding in 2000 ShelterBox has helped over 1.2 million worldwide and has received recognition by the United Nations as a lead partner in disaster relief. Their goal is to empower the people to help themselves by giving them the tools to start again. ShelterBox has evolved its program and supplies over the years and now has five different tents as well as non-tent kits customized with tarps, ropes and tools. Success has come from involving the local Rotary clubs. They are

very proud of their partnership with Rotary and our Club is still the largest contributor in the world. They are the only NGO recognized in the Philippines and are helping 1000 families and teaching roofing skills. They are assisting 10,000 displaced by Boko Haram and another 10,000 in Syria and are prepping a team to go to Lombok. Their new kit includes solar lamps made by Luminaid and she suggested solar parties as fundraisers. More to follow on that opportunity.
