

Special events will include Joe Roberts and his "Push For Change", highlighting the problems of the homeless, from children to seniors. We will also see Michael Prosserman of "Unity Charity". We have had both these men speak to our club over the past year.

Our first speaker was Alanna Scott, Chair of the Environmental Committee. She was delighted that this is now a full committee, not a sub-committee. And well deserved. This group has been involved in tree planting for 6 years including in the Don Valley, school gardens, Food Share, gardens at shelters with children, letting them get down and dirty. They have worked with LEAF (Local Enhancement & Appreciation of Forests). With financial help from the Weston Foundation they have worked on Small Parkettes, Large World, making use of small neglected parcels of lands. Here they also have a Lend-a-Book library and would welcome donations of nature-focused books. She highlighted the NFFTT (Not Far From The Tree) project which was coming up on the 18th and challenged us to come out to gather fruit that normally gets left to rot on trees. Enjoy the apples, luscious orbs, dangling in welcome from the tree, the forbidden fruit of Eden. Sorry Geoffrey, you have been replaced. And partake of the cider, both kinds.

Marcy Berg then spoke about the Women's Initiatives Committee, founded in 2004 with the first chair Marg Stanowski. Marcy was looking for a Toronto club to transfer to when she visited the WYCA building for Women on Elm Street. Besides the apartments, she found active programs for residents and others and felt the atmosphere of a safe place. Spotting the Rotary Toronto signage resulting from our massive donation, Marcy knew which club to join.

She arrived in time for the Committee's next major project, dealing with domestic sex trafficking. Under the tutelage of Wendy Leaver the Committee explored options then made a major donation to Covenant House's Safe Home which opened last week. Several of our members were there to receive a "Visionary Award" and there is a tribute on the wall to the Club in the common room. Marcy found the process an eye-opener, shocking and was surprised at the violence experienced by these women. We will never know the good we have done as it could be "a girl we know". This may seem like a drop in a puddle but the ripple effect will continue to be felt. Funds have been allocated to get the word out about the sanctuary via taxis and hotels. She challenged more men to join the Committee as well as women

Vice-president Jeff Dobson drew the ticket but the holder Maureen Bird had to be satisfied with the wine while the pot grows.
