Topic Toronto's Overdose Crisis

Kelly White is Coordinator of the Street Heath Overdose Prevention Site at Dundas and Sherbourne in Toronto, the intersection with the second highest number of calls to 911 for overdose in the entire city. She is a graduate of the University of Toronto who has been involved in grassroots struggles for social justice and frontline work with people who are marginalized for many years.

"I've lost people to overdose, and one of the hardest parts is that people are not talking about this. ... We need to bring things out of the shadows," Kelly White quoted on CBC November 11, 2018.

clearance for them to assist. Wednesday September 25th it is SAKÉ night with Neil Phillips at The National Club. Book now for a spot! October 25-27 is The District Conference in cottage country. Brian Westlake reminded us that the next Sweat Equity is in El Salvador in January 10-19, 2020. Building homes is what they do and, the best skill set is enthusiasm.

An initial installment of "The Week That Was" from Neil Phillips gave us a lively humorous report on political past and recent events. Of note was how could Italy possibly upstage the goings on in the UK Parliament. Of course, there was a wine recommendation, Rosé 2018 Beamsville!

Speaker Dr. Jennifer Murphy, a Professor of Chemistry at the University of Toronto a climate researcher, spoke about The Canadian Institute for Science, the oldest organization of its kind in Canada, founded in 1849. Her area of research is trying to answer the question "What is going on in the Arctic?"

The Arctic is changing rapidly and faster in Canada than anywhere else. Sea ice is disappearing, the permafrost is thawing and, the atmosphere is getting cloudier due to atmospheric particles. All these things are going to impact our environment. In the summer, Dr. Murphy and her grad students board the icebreaker the Amundsen (which is featured on the Canadian 50-dollar bill) costing \$60,000 a day to operate. They travel to the Arctic to collect data that will hopefully help us understand and find solutions to climate change.

Along with her scientific facts she shared some amusing anecdotes such as the scientific puzzle of why so much ammonia was in the atmospheric particles. It turned out to be from the bird poops!
