Rotarian Errol Paulicpulli in Sri Lanka

Since the Tsunami in 2004 Errol has been returning to his homeland of Sri Lanka to assist orphans. Almost 800 were orphaned by the tsunami but there are also 8,000 orphans created by the decades-long civil war. The orphanages created by those who care are not funded by the government. Errol is currently in Sri Lanka adopting his fifth orphanage. His fundraising in 2010 netted about \$30,000 which was used to build kitchens and showers for the children. His project this time is more ambitious, needing \$62,500 for work and supplies at the orphanages as well as latrines and water storage at a school. They currently have 2 toilets for almost 500 students. He is half way to this goal and is setting up the workers to get the work done.
