

Scarborough Rotary Passport Club

The Scarborough Rotary Passport Club is a civic organization consisting of people who seek to make a difference in their community by providing volunteerism and financial resources. Unlike traditional Rotary clubs that meet weekly, the Scarborough Rotary Passport Club has only five "in-person" meetings per year including the District Governor (DG) visit. Instead, our members are encouraged to attend the meetings of other Rotary clubs in the District on days and at times that are convenient for them.

Members are encouraged to:

- 1. Support the service projects and fundraising activities of any club in the District that they find appealing as their schedule permits;
- 2. Participate in District Conferences and events;
- 3. Attend the Rotary International Convention; and
- 4. Keep a log of activities they attend and submit a report with their semi-annual dues.

Membership in the Scarborough Rotary Passport Club is a privilege and an honour. The Scarborough Rotary Passport Club holds its members to the highest ethical standards. To become a member, a prospective member must be proposed by a current member of the Scarborough Rotary Passport Club. A transferring or former member of another club may also be proposed for membership by the former club. Once the board of the Scarborough Rotary Passport Club has reviewed and approved the prospective member's application, the prospective member is presented to the current club membership for acceptance. Upon acceptance, completion of a dues payment agreement and payment of the prorated annual dues, the prospective member will officially become a member of the Scarborough Rotary Passport Club. An induction ceremony for new members will be held at each quarterly "in-person" meeting of the Scarborough Rotary Passport Club.
