Immunization projects in developing countries. Rotary has joined with international health organizations in a global effort to eradicate polio worldwide by 2005.	Support of Eva's Initiative to help homeless teenagers rebuild their lives.
Some 1,000 international scholarships annually and international exchange awards to approximately 2,000 young professional and business people each year.	Organizes 'Brush-a-Mania'. This initiative involves over 5,000 local school children brushing their teeth and learning the importance (and fun) of good dental health. In 2002, we are attempting to break the world record!
The Rotary Foundation, established in 1917, which is spending some US\$60 million annually to promote international understanding through educational and humanitarian programs.	Actively involved in running and funding camp enterprise. This is a program for grade 11 and 12 students held in a 3 day Camp setting, to introduce them to business and help them prepare for their careers.
Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, a program of seminars, conferences and leadership camps to recognize and develop good citizenship and leadership qualities in young people.	Support the "Urban Violence" initiative of the Rotary Clubs of Toronto to identify a role with other Agencies to curb this problem.
World Community Service, Rotary Clubs in a donor country assisting a Rotary club in another country with manpower, funds or equipment for a community project.	Environmental restoration projects, including tree planting in the Don Valley.
Youth Exchange, a program that annually sends more than 7,000 young people of secondary school age abroad for a school year or a holiday.	Supporting the Polio Plus program of Rotary International to eradicate Polio worldwide.
Service to the elderly with low-cost housing, health care and other special services.	Supporting District 9270 in South Africa in a significant project to train the black teachers in Zwa Zulu Natal in Literacy and Numeracy.
Service to the disabled through medical treatment, rehabilitation training, sheltered workshops and recreational opportunities.  Vocational Service by promoting high ethical and vocational standards in the business and professional world.	Actively involved and provided financial aid for the construction of a Children's Hospital in the Dominican Republic.
