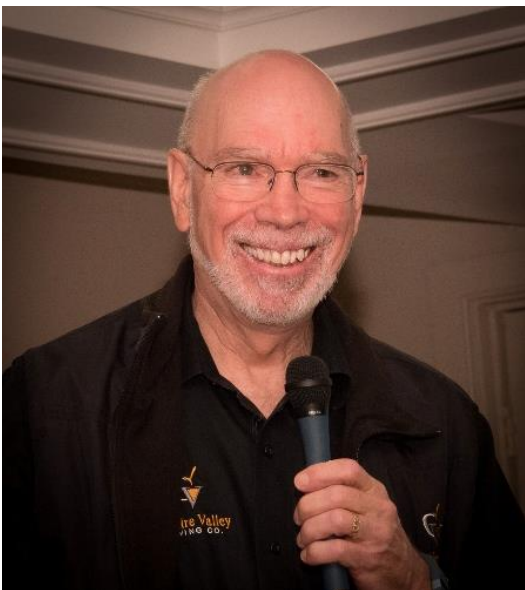
## *New Interactors make it 14!*

## *A (More than) "Mildly Amusing" Beer Talk*



On January 7, we were treated to a talk on the history and business of beermaking by Paul Dickey, brewmaster and founder of [Cheshire Valley Brewing Co.](#)

Paul is a legend in the craft brewing business. He started brewing in 1986 and has developed many award-winning craft beers. He recently founded Cheshire Valley in 2010 and operates it as a "virtual brewery" out of the facilities of Black Oak Brewery in Etobicoke.

Paul took us through the main ingredients that produce beer – malt, yeast, and hops. Malt soaked in water produces the basis for beer, yeast provides fermentation and carbonation, and hops add a slightly bitter taste for flavour and as a preservative.

Beer is one of the oldest drinks of humanity, because it can be preserved for some time. Since boiling is part of the process, water used in making beer becomes sterile and, together with natural preservatives, allows beer to be stored for many months and remain safe to drink.

The business of selling beer is very competitive, Paul said, and brewers fight to get their beers into retail distribution, at the Beer Store, LCBO, bars and lately, some grocery stores in Ontario. He said the latest move by the Ontario Government to get beer sold in grocery stores is a very welcome development for Cheshire Valley and other craft brewers.

Paul's latest creation is called "Mildly Amusing", a light ale that was featured at [Monk's Kettle](#) pub the day after he talked. It can be obtained at many local pubs. Cheers!
