

As a Rotary Mentor

Clubs around the world have found it's useful to assign new members a mentor. The mentor is someone who has something in common with the new member, has a welcoming personality, is committed to the club's growth, and is knowledgeable about Rotary. The mentor must have the time and agree to devote to helping the new member become integrated into our club. While some mentoring relationships continue for some time, the first six months are the most important.

A Mentor is Expected to:

- ✓ Let the new member know how to contact them
- ✓ Check with them regularly to make sure they're comfortable
- ✓ Introduce them to other club members
- ✓ Encourage them to invite someone they know to a meeting
- ✓ Show them Rotary's tools on My Rotary, including **Club Finder** and the **Learning Center**, and any app that our club might be using at the time
- ✓ Talk to them about open roles they could fill, as well as volunteer opportunities that might be needed
- ✓ Invite them and their family members to attend the district conference
- ✓ Accompany them to events
