

Reported that speaker's spots for the first 3 months of 2016 were filling up, however, he still needs to be advised of potential speakers for the balance of the Rotary year.


Brian noted that he has Rotary items stored at his place, and if members needed items they should call him. Please note that he does spend some time down south in the winter.

# **Program:**



The speaker this week was Rotary Club President Douglas McMillan, who gave a talk on his very recent trip to Uganda, accompanied by photographs from the trip.

Douglas McMillan, MD, FRCPC, professor emeritus at the University of Calgary, currently holds a university post-retirement position working in clinical care, research and education with an emphasis on global health of

newborn babies at the Department of Pediatrics, Dalhousie University.

Instructing Pediatric Residents and Fellows in Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine, Dr. McMillan's awards and honours include: American Academy of Pediatrics District VIII, Perinatal Pediatrics Section – Founders Award, 2015; Section of Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine, Canadian Paediatric Society – Distinguished Neonatologist Award, 2013; Canadian Paediatric Society – Life Membership, 2013.

He was at the official start of the Global Grant project at the Katalemwa Cheshire Home that our club and the Rotary Club of Muyenga have successfully started with some help from Mud Creek, Wolfville, and Hillsborough Rotary clubs. The project will train 10 disabled young adults per year for 2 years to manufacture orthopedic devices so that the 20 trained people can return to their communities and train others. This enables these disabled folk to earn a living and support themselves. The value of the Global grant is USD \$55,250. President Doug had the opportunity to address the local people gathered for the official start of the project.

President Doug was entertained and shown the area by our good friend Rotarian John Mpagi, who is a member of the Rotary Club of Muyenga. They visited the St. Paul Kasso School where we have supported a series of projects. These include school supplies, which the local ladies took advantage of to learn to read and so be able to run a business. They then purchased pigs, which the local ladies look after and breed for food and to sell. A subsequent project supplied the equipment for a maize mill to feed the pigs and chicken, which have been added to the farm established at the school.

President Doug said he was surprised and pleased to see a goodly number of signs indicating clubs from across Canada who have jointly developed projects with the Rotary Club of Muyenga.

President Doug answered questions at the end of his presentation.
