CARMEN SUSTAINABLE UPLAND DEVELOPMENT PROJECT Report/Plan December 2009

REPORT of DECEMBER

The month of December highlights the formal closing ceremonial of the 2-year project Carmen Sustainable Upland Development. The efforts and hard work of our Rotarians (both RC Davao and the funding Rotary Canada) and farmers are paid off because the main objectives of implementation are achieved: the tree plantings and the goat for enterprise development as a sub-project. However, it was noted also that, although both activities are in good progress, it gives the impression that one more year is needed for consolidation. Thus, for future replications in neighboring villages, a total of 3-years have been projected: 2 years with in each semester a new batch of farmers and 1 year for enterprise development and consolidation. To enable us to pursue the implementation of the 3rd year, we are looking hard for funding for this. In fact, any project of this kind needs 6 to 9 years before it is fully sustainable in economical and ecological sense; the basic commodities are forest trees and fruit trees that are only mature after 6-9 years.

- 1) The planned activities for the first part of December such as goat husbandry and enterprise development training was postponed as well as the forest/fruit tree planting. It was decided during the monthly PME meeting that the best time to pursue it is around Christmas or New Year combined with a formal project closing ceremonial (of the existing 2-year part);
- 2) A standard PME meeting has been held on 16 December;
- 3) The goat husbandry training was deferred to 22 December;
- 4) Forest and fruit tree planting was held last on 30 December;
- 5) The enterprise training will be proposed for next year (2010).
- a) Hedgerow planting The (7) farmers are all ready to continue with forest and fruit tree planting, although entering the planned trees in the logbooks revealed several inconsistencies regarding the number and the area available; therefore Zandro is asked during the 16 December PME meeting to review the numbers and to discuss revision of plans.
- b) Goat husbandry training A one-day training has been held on 22 December at the DA-FITS Center in Father Selga st. Davao City: 6 lecture presentations have been attended during morning and early afternoon by selected farmers, Rtn Yos, Agri-Extensionist Ben, and the MAO. In the afternoon, the Dairy Farm of Mr. Darwin Tinasas has been visited and an agreement for delivery and support of goat husbandry at the learning center with 6 goats has been made. Zandro also agreed to fast track the finishing of the goat house after which Mr. Darwin will inspect and deliver the animals early January 2010.
- c) Forest tree / Fruit tree planting On Tuesday 29 December, together with the formal closing ceremonial, a tree delivery and planting activity had been combined. We are honored with the presence of PD Wiebe and his wife and Rotary-ann Bea whom were in Davao for the seasons holiday. Also were Ben, Alex and Brian of PCEEM.
- d) Enterprise development This activity had been scheduled to take place after the goat training and it seems better to start this activity, including consolidation, in the scope of a 3rd year extension in 2010.
