The District Governor was James A. Ford of Moncton, N. B. who visited the Truro club on September 19, 1947. The International President was S. Kendrick Guernsey of Jacksonville, Florida.

In July, 1947, the Club collected \$190.00 from the members for the Paul Harris Foundation Fund. This month also, Ken Armstrong transferred to Ontario, Douglas Baker withdrew, and Walter Crocker was made an Honorary Member due to ill health. Rev. Rowley resigned. In November, Tommy Thompson resigned on account of ill health. August, 1947, the club forwarded \$190.00 for Rotary Foundation. Rev. B. D. Knott celebrated 40 years in the Ministry. Member, H. W. Murdock left for the West Coast.

In October, 1947, the Rural Urban meeting was held with the speaker being Harry Rackham. This meeting was held in Debert. New Members to the Club this year included Arthur D. Nelson, Harold Kent and Dr. Brice D. Knott, as an Honorary Member. Sandy, A. H. MacKay died in September, 1947, losing the club a very valued member.

In October, the club donated \$18.00 to redecorate the childrens room of the Truro Public Library. Boxes were sent to Britain totaling \$105.00. Through the services of the School Nurse, four pairs of glasses were donated to needy children.

Also during October, individual boxes for Britain to the extent of \$105.00 were sent. Mr. Mert Daniel returned from his trip to the West Coast and was speaker on October 17, 1947. During November, H. W. Murdock returned from the West Coast and was speaker.

The first Committee Meeting on the proposed Radio Auction was held in November, with the chairman being H. W. Murdock.

In February, the Halifax Rotary Club sponsored the Ice Carnival, Ice Capades and fourty three members went down to see it on the train. January, 1948 the Lord Depression cup was won from the Kiwanis Club.

The second fire within 13 months occured at the offices of Burchell and MacDougall in February. The Stork went to Art Manning in January and to Wilf Burchell in February, June, 1948 it changed hands again going to George Smith.

The Curling Bonspiel was held in March with Truro, New Glasgow and Pictou Clubs participating. Also in March, the Auction plans were finalized with the dates being set for April 20, 21, 1948.

In April, a small girl was sent to Halifax for plaster casts on hip. At this time there were 6413 Rotary Clubs with 310,000 members. Rotary in Action was started, C. K. C. L. with schools in Colchester County participating. Sponsored weekly by Acadia Trust.

April 20th, brought the first Rotary Radio Auction and this was a tremendous success. Chairman for this event was H. W. Murdock. This was a financial success in that \$4,400.00 was raised to carry on the work of the Club. This Auction had its comedy also, when \$65.00 was bid for several Rotarians to lead a pig down Inglis Street. This was done on the following Saturday night, with a crowd estimated in the hundreds watching. The members also had some baby sitting duties to perform, for which they were paid, but the proceeds was turned in to the Auction fund.

In May, H. N. Munro returned and was reinstated as a new member. The Rotary Clubs of Canada lost a valued member in the death of Layton Ralston in May, 1948.

In June, Westville joined the ranks of Rotary, when they organized a new club there. In Charlottetown, H. W. Murdock was elected to the Canadian Advisory Committee for 1948, 1949.

The Boy Scouts were donated \$50.00 for their summer camp.

Mr. Angus Mitchell was Rotary International President for the year 1948-1949.

The District Governor was Laurie Ellis of Kentville who visited the Truro Club in October 8, 1948. The District Conference was held at St. Andrews, N. B. on June 20, 21, 1949.. The International Convention was held in New York on June 12-16, 1949. Preston Wilcox attended from Truro.

H. W. Murdock was made a member of the Rotary Canadian Advisory Committee, and attended the Meetings. J. A. Calder of Toronto was chairman.

H. W. Murdock was also honored by the King with the C. B. E.

During the Rotary year, the club completely outfitted a room in the Colchester County Hospital, March of Books for Hospital under the chairmanship of Dr. Daniel. Presented song books to the new Westville Club. Donated \$20.00 to the Boy Scouts for the Jamboree.

July, 1948, Rotary Ann, Mrs. Bethel died.

July, 1948, the Stork went to Lorne MacDougall.

September, 1948, New members to the Truro Rotary Club included Rev. W. C. Nicholson, Frank E. Youlds, Bob MacKenzie and Sheldon Fountain.

In October, there were 18 crippled children on the list for help.

The Childrens Aid Society were donated \$50.00 by the club. The Rural Urban Meeting was held in Brookfield, with the Speaker being Will R. Birse. R. B. MacLennan headed this Meeting.

In December, 1948, the Rotary Club voted to look after one Rotary family in Europe at a cost of \$140.00. The Rozwadowsk family of Poland were chosen as the family to help. In January, letters arrived from Halina Rozwadowsk of Poland thanking us for the parcels.

The sum of \$700.00 was spent in one week on Crippled Childrens work.

In January, 1949, a boat load of supplies was shipped to France, and the club voted \$100.00 as their share in this boat of supplies.

In February, 1949, the Radio Quiz, "Schools in Action" was authorized by the club. Also on the 4th of February a Crippled Childrens Clinic was held. Reported a blue baby with only 17% chance to live, had an operation and was doing well.

The annual Curling game, Kiwanis vs. Rotarians with the Kiwanians coming out the winners, was played in January.

The President reported on five projects going at this time, 1. Auction, 2. School Quiz, 3. Loading ship for France 4. March of Books for the Library of the Hospital. 5. Crippled Childrens Clinic.

In February, the annual Ladies night was held and it was a good time.

In February, a boat sailed for France with \$3200.00 worth of food and 18 bales of clothing from District 192. On the 11th of February, the sixth Crippled Childrens Clinic was held, with 95 children examined exclusive of those for Polio, T. B. and glasses. These do not go through the clinic. The summary of this clinic was as follows.

Patients 22 (new ones -20). Advised 2. For Hospital-7, Discharged three, Treatment perscribed for 10.

In April, the stork went to Bill Cicholson. The funeral of Mayor Ex Rotarian Fent Kierstead. The proceeds of the Auction held in April was \$4000.00 with the final net of \$3,924.36. This was another very successful auction with lots of hard work and loads of fun.

In May, the Rotary Club paid out \$55.77 for milk for needy children in the schools. The Crippled Childrens Report in May was that 25 cases were taken care of and finished, two were in Hospital, and three to go when school closes. The Club wpent \$2174.36. Stork to Colin Munro.

In June, the club voted to refurnish the Rotary room in the Hospital. Also, voted \$20.00 to the Scouts for the Ontario Jambouree. A member of the Rotary Club, James Ross passed away at this time.

In December, the Crippled Childrens Clinic was held with Dr. Tom Acker in charge. Two members were made Honorary Members in December, those being D. G. Davis and George C. Smith.

Those members joining the ranks of Rotary in 1950 were, February- H. D. Lavers, and Henry Crowell. Then in April Harry Weatherby and E. B. Walker joined. Harry Chisholm was proposed, but did not join.

In January, Bob MacKenzie retired and moved to Campbellton, N. B.

April, brought about the Third Rotary Auction. Ken Lewis was chairman. Another successful event!

The Annual Rotary Bonspiel was held on March 3, 1950 with Truro, New Glasgow, Pictou and Westville participating.
