In the song, Gowan wrote:

It is through the efforts of Rotarians like you that the good catches up over and over again.

There are many people who gave of themselves and their time as I prepared to take on the job of District Governor and I thank them all for their support. However, there are a few special people who went out of their way with guidance and advice:

- Past District Governors Gord Hankin, Dorothy Brittain, Pete Smith, Dennis Knight and Duncan Conrad;
- Past District Secretary and District Trainer Kathryn Atkin; and
- Incoming District Secretary Elke Cummings.

Thanks to them, the good caught me many times.

I begin my year knowing that the District is no more than individual Rotarians and their clubs. More than anything, Rotary is those who have committed themselves to service above self. As they go, we all go. This means that my responsibility as District Governor is to try and live up to Lao Tzu's wisdom when he wrote 2,000 years ago in the "Tao Te Ching", "When the best leader's work is done, the people say, 'We did it ourselves!'. To lead, walk behind."

Rotary service is about 'we' – not 'me'. So, my over riding priority during my year is to work with the District team to support individual Rotarians and clubs to ensure the *good catches up*. A critical role in this is played by our team of Assistant Governors who will work closely with individual clubs:

- Martin Steele for Western Newfoundland and Labrador;
- Tom McCaughey, for Eastern Newfoundland;
- Marlene Lovett for Cape Breton;
- Marilyn Brown for Pictou County and Truro;
- Don MacKenzie for Halifax;
- Elva Heyge for the Valley and South Shore; and
- Derek Key for Northern Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.

My second priority is to focus on good governance and to do so by strengthening accountability and continuity within the District leadership. In that regard, I will work closely with District Governor Elect David Muise and District Governor Nominee Mark Brown and others to tighten up the District Structure. The most important part of this priority is for us to continue to build and improve the District Strategic plan. The directions in the plan come as a direct result of what individuals and clubs had to say was important:

- Improve Communications and Information Sharing. This priority will be led by Bill Kendrick from the Summerside Club.
- Enhance Public Relations and Fund Raising. This priority will be led by Past District Governor Dennis Knight.
- **Increase Membership**. Moe Rogerson will continue to lead this priority.
- Increase and Enhance Opportunities for Training. This priority will be led by Wendy Keen.
- Simplify the District Structure. I will continue to work on this

The strategic plan will be an important responsibility of David Muise. He will also work with other committee chairs on Communications (Bill Kendrick), Training (Wendy Keen), History (PDG Murray Nicol) and Awards (PDG Wayne Hambly.

District Governor Nominee Mark Brown will work with Moe Rogerson on Membership and will also support Robert Angel with Literacy, Mary Lynk with Mental Health, Gordon Harper with Friendship Exchange, Mark Vardy with Youth Exchange, Verbin Hewlin with Community Services, Dave Taylor with Vocational Service and Derek Key with a review of District by-laws.

My third priority is to continue to grow District wide support for the Foundation and I will work closely with Foundation Chair and PDG Duncan Conrad in this regard. The Foundation truly is the single most effective vehicle available to us to help the *good catch up* within our communities and around the world.

Our International President for the next Rotary year is Dong Kurn Lee from Korea. His theme for this Rotary year is "Make Dreams Real." I want to make a special point of quoting from one of the more compelling parts of one of his speeches at the January International Assembly in San Diego.

"30,000 children die every day needlessly of pneumonia, measles and malaria – for the lack of basic medicines, vaccines and mosquito nets. They die of diarrheal illnesses – for the lack of a packet of re-hydration salts that costs 10 cents. They die in the thousands, every day, because they have only dirty water to wash in and to drink. They are killed by illnesses that become deadly in combination with poor sanitation and malnutrition. They die because their families are trapped in a cycle of extreme poverty, a cycle that is not interrupted because there is no access to education. They die because their needs are not met in the areas of water, health and hunger and literacy."

DK's theme for next year is Make Dreams Real and he has chosen to continue President Wilf Wilkinson's focus on Health and Hunger; Water; Literacy; and he asks that we place a special emphasis in our efforts on children.

I ask all of you to keep these issues in mind as you make plans for your focus this Rotary year.

Finally, I repeat the point made above: The Rotary world, our District's part of that world, your clubs, your community and other communities need your commitment, your focus, your desire to serve. It is through you that the good, truly will catch up.

Thank you for all you do and all you will continue to do.

You should be thinking about the projects which you would like to move forward with matching grants or the district simplified grants.

We are in the planning stages for the District Foundation Seminar which we hope to move around the district this year, hopefully we will have two session one in Newfoundland and the other for the Maritimes.

In the next couple of newsletters we will provide info on our district focus for the Foundation for the year and will share with you the commitments clubs have made for the coming year and provide you info on specific Foundation programs and projects. Our foundation team looks forward to working with all of you as we Share Rotary. Have a great Rotary Year.
