Noltes tell of their experiences on Rotary & church missions to storm-ravaged Haiti

Gary and Cindy Nolte have been in the "mission" business since 2003, when they went to Haiti for the first time on a medical mission sponsored by their church, Trinity Lutheran of Moorhead. Gary has been on seven trips and Cindy, six. They were on their way in 2012 when their group was forced to turn back because of another earthquake there.

Their groups have been working Pignon, a village 40 miles from Port au Prince, landing at the Rotary International Airport in Pignon — built by Rotarians.

They and fellow volunteers from both their church and Rotary International have performed a variety of tasks requested by people of the village. They've refurbished a school and given it a roof, built a basketball court and provided clean water for the community, among other projects. With physicians and nurses in their party, they have also provided medical relief in two donated surgical suites.

All projects are taken on at the request of

Haitians. Gary explained that otherwise, even well-meaning projects won't be used. He cited a large sun oven that has sat unused among the trees, since the residents don't understand how to use it.

The Noltes shared images of the area they visit, with its scenery, people, the camp where they stay and the Baptist church around which their projects are center. To attend the school, children need sponsors to help with expenses, including uniforms and other fees. In an area with, at best, four hours of electricity a day, the needs are great and the means are scant.

But, they said, there is progress. Though many still live in tent cities, a good hospital has been developed, some roads have been paved, and water projects have brought clean water. Gary predicts that self-sufficiency may still be a generation away.

President Kay Parries praised Gary and Cindy for being great representatives of the very best of what Rotary stands for.
