Valley Water Rescue divers aid law enforcement's river searches & rescues

Rotarian of the Day Dale Hetland introduced the day's speakers, Pete Fendt of Valley Water Rescue and his fellow volunteers Gregg Nelson and Bud Myers ... as well as Bud's personable bloodhound Alice.

The team of divers and support staff traces its beginning to a near-tragedy in 1987 — the rescue of a young boy, Alvaro Garza, from the icy Red River. His recovery was considered the community's "Christmas miracle."

"It took awhile to gain the trust of law enforcement, but in time a partnership was

formed," Pete said.

The team currently has 13 divers and seven tenders, along with five search dogs and four handlers. Laura, who visited the club, specializes in tracking "man scent." Two of the dogs are trained to find cadavers.

The team trains outdoors every month of the year to be prepared for every kind of weather and water condition — swiftwater, blackwater, and ice rescue when temperatures dip to 30 below zero.

Valley Water Rescue divers are very different from their recreational counterparts. Safety is the primary factor. They wear dry suits costing \$2,000 and more – not the more familiar wet suits – with waterproof seals in the wrists, legs, neck and zippers. All divers have a line on them connected to their harness and weight belt.

A fully dressed backup diver is always standing by, ready to go in to assist the first diver if needed. They have audio communication and also use "line pull" to communicate. VWR also has purchased a remote-control underwater sonar device and a drone for overhead searches.
