Bryan Davidson talks about scouting mission

Bryan Davidson's classification talk focused on his work as a professional Boy Scout. He is district director of the Northern Light Council of Boy Scouts of America based in Fargo. The organization serves 10 counties in North Dakota and four in west central Minnesota.



A native of Kansas and Missouri, Bryan earned a degree in biology. Working at Lowe's after graduation, he became involved in Habitat for Humanity and in reconstruction projects for victims of hurricanes and tornados. It was his introduction to what he calls "mission work" ... enhanced when he married into a family doing international mission projects.

He volunteered with the Boy Scouts before moving into its professional management, where his responsibilities include recruiting, training and inspiring volunteers, as well as raising money and working with young people. One of area scouts' upcoming projects is to collect donations during the F-M Food Drive on Saturday, March 22. They also have outreach programs on the tribal reservations, among area citizens with disabilities and in low-income neighborhoods. High-school members take part in Explorers groups with the Moorhead Police Department, Fargo Zoo and in Hawley, Minn.
