Kinzler offers early-season tips for beautiful lawns and gardens"

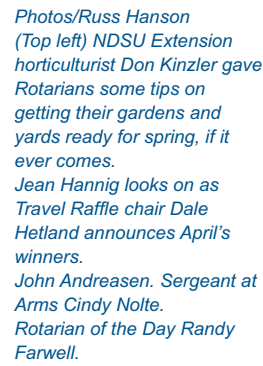
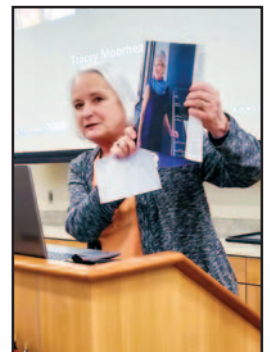

NDSU, but first mentioned good news of his own: Moorhead Rotary will be sponsoring three RYLA students this summer, two from Moorhead and one from Hawley.

Don, who grew up in Lisbon, said he may be the only guy who has moved the same 1895 house not once, but twice in 25 years ... first from Fergus Falls to a site along University Drive, and again after the flood of 2009 to its present location on higher ground.

Among the many tips he shared was one that helps pollinators do their job in spring. It’s better to leave the tops on your perennials over the winter to help native bees and other pollinators survive the season to pollinate your apples and cucumbers in the spring. Cut back when green begins to show.

But when you cut them back, keep the cut-off foliage around for awhile to let the pollinators hatch and emerge as the weather warms.
