Exchange student Frida Lehtonen reports on her year in Moorhead

Moorhead Rotary made history April 7 with its firstever "virtual meeting." After missing several weeks due to restrictions on group meetings because of the coronavirus pandemic, the club took to the internet Tuesday. Its vehicle was Zoom, a group meeting application that has become a primary tool for bringing people together from multiple locations. Treasurer Emily Gess set up the online meeting, which allows members to click a URL provided by email to join the interactive session.

President Steve Schaefer noted at the start that 31 members and several guests were aboard not unlike attendance at a typical meeting. Most were visible through video links, though several also made an audio-only appearance (so to speak) through their cellphones.

Frida shares highlights of Moorhead year

As her year in Moorhead nears an unorthodox close, Rotary International exchange student Frida Lehtonen reflected on the rewards and challenged of taking a year out of her education to live and learn in the U.S. She was inspired, she said, by her mother and her aunt, who both traveled abroad as exchange students.

Her home is in Vantaa, a safe and growing community 20 minutes from Helsinki, Finland. She has two older brothers, one of them living in New Zealand. While she is in Moorhead, her family has hosted a Minnesota exchange student in her place.

She says, "Moorhead High was overwhelming." Her school at home has 150 students, including just 40 in her grade. She'll finish the last year after she returns this summer. "I love all the opportunities at Moorhead High," she notes, including sports, choir and art. Schools in Finland focus on academics and lack the extracurriculars she has enjoyed here.

She enjoyed participating in her host families' typical American pastimes. "My first family, the Monsons, introduced me to so many fun new things: baseball, football, Thanksgiving. I loved living in the country," she says. She celebrated Christmas with her second family, the Dauners, and now is joining the Nichols family.

"I love Rotary and all the good they do in the world," she says, adding that she looks forward to our meetings Tuesdays. She also loves the other exchange students whom she's met — "my new friends from all around the world." Jean noted that, while most returned home at the start of the pandemic, Frida chose to remain here for the rest of her year.

"It's been a hard year and not what I expected," she confesses. "But I've had such a good time. I'm so thankful for all the Rotarians and strangers who are now friends.

"It has changed my life. Thank you, all, for making this possible for me." She left us with a quote: Exchange isn't a year in your life. It's a life in a year.
