

President Dave Sederquist welcomed Moorhead Rotarians along with prospective member Carmen Escobar, director of River Pointe of Moorhead.



The president reminded members that they have










received two invoices, one for 4th quarter 2022, the other (under the new dues structure) for 1st quarter 2023. He also noted that two service projects are coming up May 2 and 11, when members will gather to de-litter Exit 1 interchange on I-94 and Eighth Street South, Moorhead's "front door." He also hinted the club may volunteer to offer prizes and handle a stop/turn around point for the kayak and canoe race coming up May 11.

Founder traces history of Recital with a Cause

John Andreasen recounted the history of the highly successful Recital with a Cause, a five-club project that has generated hundreds of thousands of dollars since its beginning in 2010.

He told how the idea came to him in the shower during his year as our club's president. He realized that the community offered few opportunities to appreciate the musical gifts of its young artists — including his own daughter Karen, who'd excelled as a violinist.

Since that beginning, the FM Rotary Foundation has raised a total of \$218,479 in its annual concerts. After expenses, that has meant \$157,463 in proceeds donated to Rotary's Polio Plus, along with \$34,050 presented to the local youth symphonies. The Polio Plus proceeds have doubled their impact with matching funds from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

Established in 1988, Polio Plus has had enormous global impact. That year, 350,000 new cases were recorded worldwide. By 2021, the number had been reduced to 5 in only Pakistan and Afghanistan.

Andreasen urged members to continue their donations, as well. Each Rotarian is asked to contribute \$100. The 2023 concert takes place at 7 p.m. May 4 in First Lutheran Church.

Sergeant Cindy tells more about Polio Plus

Sergeant at Arms Cindy Nolte followed up with more information on Polio Plus's global impact before turning to happy dollars. Bill Craft's buck honored his 87-year-old father, who went to India as part of a past polio campaign. Other dollars honored Gary, Cindy and John, who have also





participated. Dave's dollar honored Nancy Hanson "for all you do for us."

Heart 'n' Soul Cafe feeds the hungry

Rotarian of the Day Katie Fredericksen introduced speaker Leola Dahl, founder of the Heart 'n' Soul Cafe. Its premise: "Make everyone feel welcome, regardless of need." Initially taking place in Josie's Cafe, the volunteer organization now prepares homemade lunches in First Presbyterian Church of Fargo. They're now distributing the weekly meals from a food trailer in various locations — a boon to seniors, youth and others who may not have transportation to travel to a central site.

"We partner with farmers and local businesses," Dahl told the club. "It's about more than the food. It's building community and friendships."
