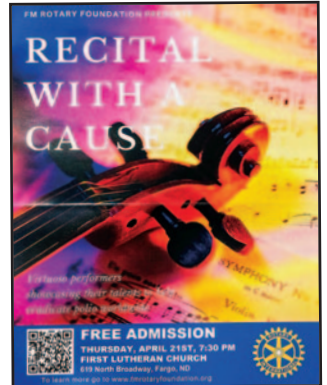

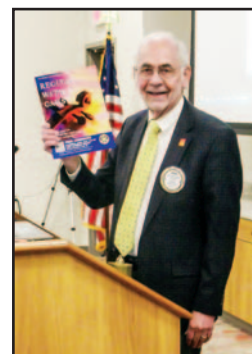
Make your reservations for our Centennial Dinner coming up May 4 at Concordia

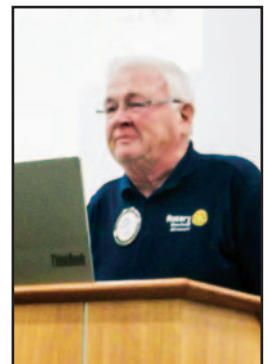
Recital With a Cause is back after two-year pandemic hiatus

Since then, the Recital has contributed \$103,000 to Polio Plus and more than \$30,000 to the FM Symphony Orchestra and FM Area Youth Symphonies. As always, it will feature performances by some of the region’s finest young musicians.

Each member of all five Fargo-Moorhead Rotary units has already received a packet containing a poster to display in the community and a donation envelope. Donations can be made via the QR code on the poster. Paul Harris Foundation points will be awarded for gifts of more than \$100.

John’s daughter, professional violinist, Karin Andreasen Gamball, who was a featured young artist in 2010, has been invited to perform on April 21. Jean noted that two Rotary exchange students also performed in 2010.
