Samantha Havran traces home-grown bioscience leader Aldevron's rapid growth

Rotarian of the Day Greg Johnson introduced our program presenter Samantha Havran, senior manager of talent acquisition at fast-growing Aldevron Inc. She told about how she came to move from General Mills in the Twin Cities five years ago: "A recruiter found me on LinkedIn and told me, 'This company wants you,'" she explained. He added, "It's growing like crazy. If you



take this job, jump on the rocket ship and hang on!"

Aldevron, with its roots at NDSU, develops critical raw materials for the health-care industry. Its clients are developing medical products. Its most successful line is plasmid DNA proteins used in genetic medicines for gene and cell therapy. They are a key ingredient in Covid-19 vaccines.

"Aldevron is at the center of this industry," she said. "We supply the materials researchers use to develop vaccines and therapies. We lay the groundwork for vital new discoveries worldwide."

Founded in 1998 in a small laboratory on the campus of North Dakota State University by Michael Chambers and John Ballantyne, Aldevron — had grown to more than 530 employees in 2020 and 800 today. It was recently acquired by the Daneher Corp. of Washington, D.C., for \$9.6 billion. The company operates in a state-of-the-art 189,000 sq. ft. facility in south Fargo.

"Like Rotary, we want to make lives better," she said, adding, "We may help cure cancer someday."
