Rotarians learn much more about Moorhead Fire Department

Sixteen Moorhead Rotarians gathered in the shadow of two call-ready fire trucks Dec. 12 for a visit to the Moorhead Fire Department's Station #1. Five firefighters joined the group to tell the story of the first responders' mission to keep Moorheaders safe, following up on more than 4,800 calls each year.

President Steve Astrup — himself a volunteer with the neighboring Dilworth Fire Department — reminded members of several upcoming events. Though no meetings will be held on the days after Christmas and New Year's Day, the club is invited to celebrate the holiday season Thursday, Dec. 28, at the home of Gary and Cindy Nolte, 117 38th Circle Ave. S., from 5 to 7 p.m.

He urged members to sign up for one of two Rotary volunteer sessions Jan. 11 and 13 to help Feed My Starving Children reach its goal of packing 10 million meals for starving children around the globe. (The sign-up links are included in the email carrying this Paddlewheel.)

Five Moorhead firefighters — including several who also volunteer with the Dilworth unit — were on hand to introduce club members to their equipment and procedures. The battalion chief introduced the department, which has two stations including the one we visited and another on the south side. A third is being planned, though the location has not been decided.

Firefighters fill three alternating 24-hour shifts, each with 11 members. They work for 24 hours every other day for nine days, then get four days off. Justin noted that while the number of calls has doubled since 2008, the number of firefighters remains the same.

Calls for service are ranked based on severity, and teams and rigs are dispatched based on need. Everyone on each shift is trained to do it all, from medical rescue to taking on fires of every size and cause. In addition, the department is one of 13 in Minnesota that has special training in handling hazardous materials disasters.

Among the department's equipment are a 100-foot ladder truck, as well as two boats equipped with sonar to see beneath the surface of the murky Red River. They also have ice-rescue gear. Asked about cost, Rosenfeldt said that the cost has skyrocketed in recent years. A fire engine now sells for over a million dollars; the ladder truck, bought for \$800 thousand, would cost \$2 million if bought today.
