Memory Cafe founder says worst part is isolation after dementia diagnosis

Eric Wilkie introduced Deb Kaul, executive director of the Memory Cafe of the Red River Valley. Deb, a registered nurse, told of her journey to found the local program after caring for both of her parents through several forms of dementia.

"People with memory loss are often forgotten but also neglected, mostly because we don't know how to interact with them. Friends and family disappear," she said. "Dementia caregivers are unique. With other illnesses, their friends and family chip in to help in many ways ... but not with memory issues. We need to educate the community — the family and friends — about how to support them."

Memory Cafe holds gatherings for caregivers and their loved ones every Wednesday, alternating between Bethel Church, the Hjemkomst Center and its own Live, Laugh & Love Center in Fargo. Average attendance, she said, is 63, including caregivers, volunteers and those with memory issues. More information on participating in their free programs is at www.memorycaferrv.org.
