

Paul Dovre shares good news amidst bad in Rotary's traditional Christmas message


President Dave Sederquist welcomed Moorhead Rotarians and guests to the club's final meeting of 2022 on Dec. 13. He opened the meeting with the music of Fargo-Moorhead's Blenders singing "Hark the Herald Angels Sing," one of the highlights of their annual week of local performances.

He congratulated two Rotarians with some of the club's longest tenures — Gary Nolte and Kay Parries, both of whom are celebrating their 34th Rotary anniversaries today. Another of the club's most veteran members, Ron Kolb, was on hand for the meeting; he joined the club Jan. 14, 1975.

Heather Ranck updates club on progress of Rotary PlayHill coming to Moorhead

Fargo Rotarian Heather Ranck joined us to share good news about the Rotary Natural PlayHill to be built next year just north of First Avenue North in Moorhead. She said, "Four years of effort are culminating with the invitation for construction bids." New architectural renderings show the playground — a project of all five F-M Rotary Clubs — taking shape.

One bit of news: It's now called the "Rotary PlayHill," not "playground," as it has been known until now. She explained that "playground" is a

specific technical term with a host of standards and requirements that come along with it.

According to Heather, the hill on which play equipment will be installed needs to be cleaned up first to remove the rubble beneath its surface.

The total cost of the project is \$1.1 million ... or \$1.3 million, if the proposed bike park is to be added back into the project. So far, 84% of the funds have been raised. The committee is making a final push to contact companies that haven't donated to reach the goal. She asked for volunteers to help approach the people they know with those targeted firms.

years in Rotary." After sharing sad news about the death of past district governor Earl Roger, Gary highlighted an achievement in generosity — Fargo-Moorhead's five clubs have sent \$41,000 to Polio Plus, including \$28,000 from our club.

Finally, John Andreasen led the club in singing a trio of much-loved Christmas songs, leading into another much-loved tradition: Paul Dovre's holiday message.

Dovre: 'Grace & gratitude are calling us'

Paul cited a lyric from the Master Chorale Christmas concert as his theme: "How astonishing is Advent!@ How astonishing that the Lord of all was born in a stable!" He reflected on his year, with the death of friends and family ... yet a granddaughter's receiving her medical degree, a grandson his master's, and a great granddaughter on the way. To the list, he added a national election that occurred without protest or irregularity, our witnessing of miracles and charity, and our country coming to the aid of Ukraine.

Yet bad news lingers. "Gun violence," he said. "Dishonesty is excused, and racism and antisemitism are too well accepted.

"The good news/bad news story is astonishing," he said. "Clearly we are part of the problem.

"But God is more interested in creating good news out of bad with forgiveness, making all things new and refreshed. Grace and gratitude are calling us. And that is the good news of the season."
