Minnkota manager details recycling process



Sarge Dave salutes snowless January


Sergeant at Arms Dave Sederquist tested members on their knowledge of annual snowfall,



Aldrich stresses value of recycling


Dave introduced Mary Aldrich, sales and marketing manager for Minnkota Recycling. She told the company's story, beginning in 1975 when Beverage Wholesalers introduced Olympia Beer and took on the recapture and recycling of cans.

Minnkota accepts paper, certain plastics, aluminum and tin cans from Moorhead and Fargo, as well as communities throughout the Dakotas and northwest Minnesota.

The advent of single-stream recycling increased their volume, but not all discarded containers can be remanufactured by the companies Minnkota sells to. Plastics, for example, are limited to bottles, jugs and tubs — with the lids or caps removed and discarded with regular garbage. Plastic film, such as grocery sacks, can be turned into other products. but it must be returned to one of the big box stores for recycling.

Glass bottles and jars are still recyclable, too — just not accepted in the cities' blue bins. They should be collected separately and brought to specific dumpsters in local recycling collection sites.
