Fargo downtown director Graffeo: 'Vibrant downtowns don't just happen. They take work'

Acting president Jean Hannig welcomed Moorhead Rotarians in person at the Moorhead School Ops Center and online via Zoom. Among guests were two youngsters, Saige and our speaker's daughter Yve, who joined their parents because school had been cancelled due to bad weather.

Jean noted Rotary's theme for February is "Peace and World Understanding" — a timely message, given the state of the world.

She announced that once again, the District 5580 Conference planned for St. Cloud later this spring has been cancelled due to the pandemic. It will be broadcast online. Sarge Steve ponders unknown failures

Sergeant at Arms Steve Astrup shared insights from the book *How Nonconformists Run the World*. He asked: Do we know all of Shakespeare's failed plays? Picasso's thousands of less-than-brilliant paintings? No, he said, "we just recognize the successes. Much of our work is average or routine, but this book suggests quantity — trying and trying again — is the way to succeed and eventually produce masterpieces.

DCP leader tells of creating vibrant downtown

Rotarian of the Day Jean Hannig introduced Cindy Graffeo, executive director of Fargo's Downtown Community Partnership (and formerly Moorhead's economic development director). "Building and maintaining a vibrant downtown takes work — people, businesses, taxes, promotions, events, advocacy and physical place-making," she told the club.

In addition to providing those ideas and that energy, the nonprofit organization of downtown businesses and interests administers the city's Business Improvement District. The BID, formed in 2012, works with issues ranging from trash removal to public safety, hospitality, graffiti removal, ordinance enforcement and snow removal.

Events are a big part of the DCP's work. The DCP has been the main sponsor of the St. Patrick's Day Parade for the past three years; its 25th edition is scheduled this year for March 19.

Members asked Cindy about crime and safety in the area. She responded, "Downtown isn't any more dangerous than West Acres." The perception is a population and time-of-day thing, she said, especially at bar closing time. She added that the DCP has security and provides safety escorts.
