A century of Rotary on six continents

Sergeant at Arms Teresa Joppa picked up the 100-year theme with a report from The Rotarian magazine on a century of service on six continents. She highlighted the contributions of the first clubs in Madrid, Paris, Tokyo, Mexico City, Melbourne and Auckland and Wellington. Today Rotary has 232 clubs in Spain, 1,077 in France, 2,237 in Japan, 609 in Mexico, 1,030 in Australia, and 226 in New Zealand.

Happy dollars were offered up for past president Jerry Rogers's and Gina's service, with John Andreasen urging us each to throw in an extra \$5 in their honor. Russ Hanson announced his daughter Patti Vetter's dining center at NDSU has won the silver award from the National Association of College and University Food Services for its cuisine and service. Ernie Simmons celebrated his return to attending meetings in person, and others shared appreciation of happy vacations and a pleasant holiday weekend.



Street Fair expected to break records

Rotarian of the Day Jean Hannig introduced Shelly Gompf, the interim president of Fargo's Downtown Community Partnership. She works as a business consultant and directs the healthcare leadership program at Concordia College.

This week's Downtown Street Fair, she said, is the largest ever. Artist and crafts booths will stretch from Main Avenue to the churches at Seventh Avenue. Rotarians are serving as crossing guards, and will also have a booth there. "It's the only one we've allowed due to your volunteerism," she said. It will showcase plans for the Natural Playground in Memorial Park in Moorhead.

Some 150,000 visitors are expected over the fair's three-day run. The line-up includes 180 creators' booths and more than 40 food vendors. The food court extends along the south end of Broadway from Main to First Avenue North.

A concert by the Gear Daddies is scheduled at 5:30 Thursday. A petting zoo will also be featured, along with a "puppy pit stop" for those who bring dogs.

She pointed out that plenty of parking is available, with 1,800 spots in downtown parking ramps. A free shuttle will pick up fair-goers at the Moorhead Center Mall, making the round trip every 5 minutes.
