

District Gov. Dave Long visits Moorhead

President Steve Astrup, presiding for the first time in his term, welcomed District Governor Dave Long to Moorhead Rotary July 18. First, though, he asked members to share a moment of silence in honor of fallen Fargo Police Office Jake Wallin, who was killed on July 14. "It hits too close to home," Steve said. "He exemplified 'service above self."

Steve reminded members of several current Rotary fund-raisers by Fargo clubs, including the annual sale of Colorado peaches and a football raffle.

Sergeant at Arms Bill Woods noted that he would skip the traditional fining of members for not wearing their Rotary pins, since Gov. Dave thoughtfully distributed new ones. He went on to call for Happy Dollars. Kay Parries led off with a donation in honor of the governor and the goingout-of-business sale that has just begun at K & Krafts. Jean Hannig's dollars were for "lots of happy things," including the governor's visit and the Central States Rotary Youth Exchange meeting she attended in Michigan. Chris Andreasen, who coaches a youth soccer team, reported they won the recent Rotary tournament. Dave Tranby recommended members spend the evening at Brent Brandt's "mystery movie night." Teresa celebrated her trip to Denver to visit daughter Lydia, who was about to start training with the Lakewood, Colo., police department.

Gov. Dave tells his personal Rotary story

Dave Long, who grew up in Moorhead, shared the story of his growing involvements over the years in Rotary International, which led to his current

position at the head of the geographically largest district in North America.

"I was invited as a guest to the Detroit Lakes Rotary Club more than 10 years ago, and then invited to join again, and again, and again," he recounted. "Finally I joined the noon club."

That was in 2014. Since then he has attended eight international conventions and has served as an assistant governor and member of the district grant committee.

Dave worked in manufacturing for more than 30 years. After spending several more years as a parttime engineering consultant and teacher, he is now fully retired.

RI President Gordon McInally's initiatives for 2023-2024, he said, are to prioritize mental health along with building peace and empowering girls. His own goals for the district are, first of all, mental health, as well as the environment and collaboration between clubs and with other organizations.

He noted the district has money for two club grants — one for a project related to the environment, another for focusing on mental health — and challenged our club to come up with service projects related to these areas. He also encouraged members to step up to help make next year's district conference here in Fargo-Moorhead a success.
