# Update on Rotary Natural Playground

The Rotary Natural
Playground project is
moving forward, with a
groundbreaking tentatively
planned in September.

The project was held up this summer after discovering rubble in the hillside and determining the best course of action with the help of KLJ Architects and Rotarian Scott Kolbinger. The committee, architects and engineering team met with Moorhead officials July 17. The Foundation is awaiting confirmation that insurance will cover the project, including mitigation efforts.

Fund-raising is within \$77,440 of reaching our \$1 million goal. The Foundation has received \$523,175 in cash, with \$399, 385 in outstanding pledges. The city of Moorhead is providing gap financing to cover pledged amounts over the next 5 years.

# Speaker describes helping people reach their potential in jobs where they feel appreciated

Rotarian of the Day Randy Farwell introduced our guest speaker, David Dietz. In addition to heading Preference Employment Solutions in Fargo, he is the current president of the FM AM Rotary Club.

The firm dates back to 1987. They find staff and provide payroll and human relations services for small business. "The organization has changes a lot in the past 5 years," Dietz said, mentioning their move to a new building three years ago and change to an amployee-owned business.

"Our main purpose is to help people reach their potential. We impact lives," he said, "and benefit businesses that provide rewarding work." Their goal, he said, is to help jobseekers find the right workplace where they feel valued and they can accomplish rewarding work.

Preference helps a lot of executives looking to advance as well as people entering the working world for the first time. "We exist for two reasons — to make a profit, and to serve a purpose, helping people reach their potential," he stressed.

The company currently has 19 staffers, soon increasing to 20. They primarily serve the Fargo-Moorhead area. Most of the jobs they fill are full-time, though some are looking for temporary or part-time positions with flexibility.

Preference's areas of specialization include professional searches, business-to-business sales, construction managers and superintendents, and staffing of warehouses and call centers.

"Many of those who come to us are already employed, so they want to do a confidential job search," Dave said. His company helps people change careers or the type of work they do. "We can help you figure out what your transferable skills are," he added. They also do "pop-up" career fairs.

He noted that for the past three years, Preference has ranked among the community's "top 25 best employers to work for."

"The average person in the employment recruiting business stays with a company for 2 years. But a good share of our people have been with us for 10 years or more," he added proudly.
