Film-maker Sean Coffman tackles issue of homelessness in North Dakota

President Jerry Rogers welcomed 18 Rotarians to the weekly Zoom meeting, but pivoted immediately to good news: Beginning next week (March 16), the club will be partially resuming the face-to-face meetings that were discontinued in favor of video almost exactly one year ago.

Moorhead Rotary is launching hybrid meetings. Those who are comfortable meeting in person will gather in the new Moorhead Schools Operation Center at 1313 30th Ave. S. If you RSVPed by last Wednesday, you'll get a box lunch provided by the Concordia Catering Service; otherwise, bring your own lunch. Non-profit Human Family producing film series that humanizes homeless crisis

Rotarian of the Day Rob Remark introduced our speaker, Sean Coffman. The film-maker grew up in a military family that lived in many locations. After completing a bachelor's degree in social theory, he studied humanitarian diplomacy in Geneva, Switzerland. He worked in hotel and hospitality marketing and baseball before moving to the American Red Cross, where he handled disaster response services for six years.

Today Sean is executive director of the nonprofit Human Family, whick seeks to educate, engage and facilitate discussion in our communities around local and word-wide human rights topics through the work of filmmakers and artists. Among its projects is the North Dakota Human Rights Film Festival, as well as others focused on LGBTQ and environmental issues.



Sean is currently working on a 10-part series of films that aim to dispel the stigmas surrounding homelessness. He says "Home: the Homelessness Crisis in North Dakota" is being used to prompt community discussions and education surrounding the topic.

"We are trying to humanize the people so others can begin to understand and to care about homelessness," he said.

Two of the ten projected episodes are done, and he and his crew are working on a third. This one focuses on human trafficking and the sex trade. They recently filmed in Minot and Bismarck.

Understanding housing as a human right and as an inherent need to the health and happiness of all persons, the series examines the myths of

homelessness, its causes and highlights the statewide organizations and individuals engaged in the fight to end homelessness in North Dakota.

The series is available to watch online. It is also free to organizations and institutions wishing to incorporate educational opportunities about homelessness. Individuals may purchase individual episodes or the entire series through the Human Family's online store."

"Home" was named best documentary short at the Los Angeles Film Awards and was recently selected for the Venice Short Film Festival.

Opening the floor for questions, Sean told members that after working in corporate and nonprofit positions, he "took some personal time and rediscovered [his] love of film."

"I decided to use it for good," he said.

Funding for the Human Family organization comes from individuals and grants from organizations like the North Dakota Consensus Council and Council for the Humanities.
