Sarge Ernie tells tales of St. Patrick

Sergeant at Arms Ernie Simmons noted the real story behind St. Patrick's Day. Patrick (Padraig) was the patron saint of Ireland. Born in Roman Britain, he was martyred in the 5th century after being captured by Irish pirates. The saint-to-be spent 16 years tending sheep as a slave; that isolation led to his religious conversion. After becoming a priest, a voice called him back to Ireland.

Ernie noted, "P.S. — he didn't really drive snakes out of Ireland. There is no scientific evidence of snakes ever being there."

Happy dollars were contributed for ski trips, children in speech tournaments, good care for

senior parents at Eventide's The Linden, and for simply being Irish.

GiGi's Playhouse serves individuals with Down syndrome and families

Rotarian of the Day Steve Schaefer introduced Heather Lorenzen, executive director of GiGi's Playhouse. It opened in 2015 as the 25th Down syndrome achievement center across the nation and the first in North Dakota. It offers free educational and therapeutic programs to individuals with Down syndrome from birth to adulthood, along with their families and the community.

The Fargo organization has worked with more than 190 families. Programs, which are free to families, help in the development of motor movements, literacy, math and basic life skills

A disastrous fire last year in its rented location on 32nd Avenue South in Fargo has forced GiGi's Playhouse to find a new location. The organization is currently raising funds for a new home. "Rebuilding has taught me to appreciate everything about our programs and our people,"
