

Mayor Carlson & Manager Mahli address Moorhead opportunities & concerns

President Jerry Rogers welcomed members Tuesday who attended in two ways - at socially distant tables in the Moorhead Schools Operations Center, and online via Zoom.

In honor of our guests, trivia master Brent Brandt quizzed members on Moorhead trivia. Sergeant at Arms Rob Remark, speaking via streaming video, welcomed members' Happy Dollars: Tracey Moorhead gave her dollar in honor of our speakers, and Violet Deilke applauded her dog. Bill Woods simply appreciated opening and enjoying his potato chips.

Eric Wilkie celebrated Ron Kolb's return to our inperson meeting and shared his appreciation of being able to meet in dual - hybrid - mode. Russ saluted imminent completion of the club's grant application to District 5580; we are asking for a \$5,000 matching grant to support our centennial "literacy and culture project." Randy Farwell's happy dollar pointed to the Bison's unexpected win.

Mayor Carlson exuberantly donated a purse-full of change, reminding us that she previously presented to the group about her "day job" with the Guests 3/23/21 Mayor Shelly Carlson City Manager Dan Mahli set up enough tables for social distancing. Carlson & Mahli highlight exciting developments in city of Moorhead

Rotarian of the Day Teresa Joppa introduced our speakers with a brief true and false quiz about Mayor Carlson, who was appointed by the City Council to fill the vacancy left by Johnathan Judd when he was named a judge in the Seventh District. All her questions were "true": that Shelly's family has hosted a Rotary foreign exchange student in the past; that she used to work at the Rape and Abuse Center; and that she's married to a former Moorhead police officer.

The mayor promoted meny of the new business that have appeared in town, including the new coffee shop and restaurant that opened during the time of pandemic restrictions. She highlighted progress of the city's bike and walking trail system. Nearing completion, it will soon reach all the way from M.B. Johnson Park to the Bluestem Center for the Arts. The Midtown Trail portion from Woodlawn to Gooseberry, the last remaining section, has finally received funding and may be completed this summer. A pedestrian bridge over the river at Bluestem is in the talking stages. someday moving to the trail system, a distance of 13 miles.

Manager Mahli told the group, "I'm not so impressed by city managers — I'm more impressed with the city staff who make the city work."

He handed out information about new and exciting developments coming to Moorhead: "The amount of development is incredible, given the challenges of the past year." The 2020 projects — including a good deal of housing — totaled more than \$200 million more than 2019.

"Moorhead is an amazing place," he continued. "We have weathered the pandemic, like prior recessions, with resiliency ... mostly because of the people who live here."

He added, "We are the place for people who need a place like America. Our diversity is valuable. Moorhead encourages it and educates everyone to achieve their dreams."

Members asked about whether the city is overbuilding rental or commercial space. He answered no, citing 60% of residents who are home owners and 40% renters. About empty commercial space, he noted, "What is empty is old and built in the 1970s or before. It badly needs an overhaul."
