Board discusses Rotary grants



a world where people unite and take action to create lasting changing across the globe, in our communities and within ourselves." The 1.2 million Rotarians, joined in 35,000 clubs, focus on making a difference in many ways, from eradicating polio, providing shelter boxes to disaster victims and building schools to local projects like the Field of Dreams, dictionary project, RYLA leadership camp and helping feed the hungry.

John collected several happy dollars. Teresa Joppa kicked them off: "I'm happy to be here. I was in the hospital recently, and my doctors made sure that I can be here today."

Dave Tranby offered a happy dollar for guest Jon Ammerman, "a real quality individual." Brett Drevlow announced he got a new puppy, and Steve Schaefer saluted three successful events at Concordia, MSUM and NDSU last weekend, in which students raised \$35,000 to support the Children's Miracle Network.

Fox Sports North video "Dream.State" captures excitement, tradition of Spuds

Rotarian of the Day Jade Rosenfeldt introduced speaker Jon Ammerman, a teacher and head hockey coach at MHS, with excerpts from the Fox Sports North series "Dream. State," which focused on Spud tradition this season. The programs can be viewed on YouTube.

Jon, a Moorhead native, graduated from St. Cloud State University. He's in his fifth year as head coach.

Jon explained how MHS hockey and the independent Moorhead Youth Hockey Association promote hockey in our community. "We are proud of being a community-based model - a private rather than park department organization -- so the kids play for our community," he said. MYHA serves youth from age 4 to 18, with 630 players on 58 teams.

Forty-seven Division I athletes have come from the Spud program – among them, 11 NHL draft picks, six NHL players, and three Olympians, including 2015 grad Will Borgen, who played in the 2018 Winter Games.

He said the community has an ice shortage, with all rinks booked from 5:30 a.m. to 11 p.m. "We're adding another sheet of ice," he said, adjacent to the present 20-year-old facility, which is also getting a new ice plant, locker room, roof, dehumidification system and improved viewing areas.

Of the Spuds' heart-breaking final loss, the coach said, "It's not a good ending." The emotions were captured in the Fox TV series. "I think the series captured the perfect story of the community -- a community that supports its youth," he observes The kids are part of something bigger ... and they're expected to go to the state tourney every year." Beyond game footage, the series sees the final loss through their eyes. "It was not the ending we would like," Jon said, "but it's a more realistic story for life."
