


Director of Lotus Center explains harm reduction approach to treating addiction

President-Elect Dave Sederquist welcomed Moorhead Rotarians — both in person and online — to Tuesday's meeting, along with guest speaker Sarah Chatelain-Gress, executive director of The Lotus Center in Moorhead.

The meeting began with Dave's word of the day: zeitgeist, the defining spirit or mood of a particular period of history as shown by the ideas and beliefs of the time. Members celebrated May birthdays and anniversaries before viewing a video presented by the president of the club in Ely, Minnesota. He detailed his group's program of public relations and image-building, including support of city benches, the Fire Department, picnic tables in the local park, and benches and tables as part of a veterans memorial. "All these things helped drive our membership and donations," he said, "leading to more projects."

Sarge Chris educates on LGBTQIA Day

Sergeant at Arms Chris Andreasen noted that May 7 was LGBTQIA Day, the day the courts made homosexual marriage legal. He pointed to Rotary's commitment to diversity and inclusion, explaining the acronym stands for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning, intersex and asexual individuals.

Chris himself offered the first of the day's happy dollars for the birth of his second child and a professional step forward — his program Pathways' sale to the board of Trinity Lutheran. Dave told of a hike that was "very wet and very

adventurous." Eric Wilkie shared good wishes with new president Dave and for our speaker, who he said "is doing great work in the community." Dave Tranby shared that he and his wife welcomed their Colorado son, who came to Moorhead for his birthday.

What is 'harm reduction'? Sarah explains

Rotarian of the Day Eric Wilkie introduced Sarah Chatelain-Gress, who with partners saw the need for a new treatment center for addiction recovery. The Lotus Center. Sarah and her staff provide intensive and low-intensive therapy services to those recovering from substance abuse.

The Lotus Center takes a different route to helping substance users recover from their alcohol or drug habits than most addiction recovery programs. Its staff of licensed addiction counselors ask clients what they want to achieve, rather than dictates a hard-and-fast goal of complete abstinence.

"We don't care what you're using or how much you use right now," she explains. "We want to know why you use it. Addiction is a coping mechanism. Once we understand the reasons, we can deal with it. Substance abuse is a chronic, long-term disease. Ninety days of treatment isn't enough. Recovery is a life-long process."
