EPIC's Braaten describes development firm's projects, past, present and future

President-elect Dave Sederquist welcomed members and guest speaker McKenzy Braaten to the Moorhead Schools Operations Center Tuesday, April 26, starting the meeting with good news.

The 11th annual Recital With a Cause was a big success. Sponsored by the FM Rotary Foundation, the evening of stellar performances by the area's finest young musicians generated a total of more than \$50,000 in donations, according to John Andreasen — a substantial increase from last year's \$43,000 total.

Most of the recital funds are earmarked for Rotary International's Polio Plus campaign to eradicate polio around the world. According to an RI broadcast that morning, Cindy Nolte said, the service organization *will* be able to achieve that goal. Members also watched a video produced for World Immunization Week April 24-30 on vaccinations for all preventable diseases.

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards chair Randy Farwell reported that the annual camp for high










EPIC construction firm grows from three employees to 70 in 5 years

Rotarian of the Day Rob Remark introduced McKenzy Braaten of EPIC Companies, noting that the firm — formed in 2017 — has gone from three to 70 employees in just five years. It now serves nine communities, including Moorhead, from its offices in West Fargo and Minot.

Braaten, vice president for communications, announced a new division — an architectural team

that has joined the construction firm.

"The mixed-use concept is changing to include more options in the same development with residences and commercial tenants," she told the club, "including park space and concert venues."

Steve Gehrtz, former Moorhead city council member and resident, is president of the company. Braaten cited several past Moorhead projects, including Block E at the southeast corner of Main Avenue and Eighth Street South and Vanne Apartments, a mixed-use building on First Avenue North with commercial space and apartments."It filled up very fast," she commented.

EPIC also manages Comstock Commons and the Red Door Townhomes on Eighth Street north of Concordia. An upcoming project will be located downtown at the end of the Center Avenue Bridge at Third Street. To be called Bolig Square, the six-story development will include underground parking. Completion is projected in Fall 2024.

She talked about some of the community events her firm has been promoting. It's a co-sponsor of Norsk Hostfest in Minot this year. Concerts have been staged in the open square of The Lights in West Fargo as well as art shows. "We try to incorporate art into all we do," she commented.

Coming up are a new project in Perham and another on 45th Street South in Fargo. Incorporating an indoor/outdoor water park, it's been named "The WAVE by EPIC." It will include a 125-room hotel, and is envisioned as a destination place for fun.
