Grieving parents comforted by Hopeful Hearts nonprofit, say Burgard & Sorum

After hearing the Star-Spangled Banner, he tapped trivia master Brent Brandt. In honor of the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday, he quizzed members of trivia related to the 1987 movie "Planes, Trains and Automobiles," the John Hughes film he called the "best Thanksgiving movie ever."

Sarge Paul: Remedies for outrage & anger

newborn child.

"We were two strangers who quickly became friends, and it all started with a simple coffee date in November 2017 to talk about two of our greatest loves, Hope and Henry," Jen said. "our babies were born just seven weeks apart ... and our lives were shattered the day we died."

That was the first day of the new reality that, though their babies had died, somehow they still had to go on. "Even though we each knew we needed to recover physically and emotionally, there was no guide to doing so — no direction, no clear path," she said. "We both asked ourselves and others why there wasn't more help. Why there wasn't more specific support? We knew we were far from the first mothers this had happened to, and sadly even further from the last."

They started with "Hope Gifts" to comfort parents suffering loss. The gifts are a collection of selfcare items procured by two loss moms designed to provide comfort and promote the importance of healing. "We want these parents to know right away that they are not alone and that they will keep surviving s- even on the hardest, most difficult days," the women explained.

They offered bereaved parents a much-needed opportunity to talk about their experiences and interact with others who understood their pain. The project has grown to include classes on coping with out-of-order deaths.

Hopeful Hearts has two doulas who can provide guidance and support un these difficult circumstances. They also refer parents to other resources that may help in their time of need, including organized support groups and counseling.

Their nonprofit organization is supported by donations, including participation in Giving Hearts Day in February.

Parents are referred to them by word of mouth. Information on what they do is also offered by local hospitals. Their "care packages" can also be requested on their website, hopefulheartproject.org.
