
Happy dollars celebrated many pluses. Dale Hetland expressed pleasure that we're singing again. Nancy Hanson saluted Steve Astrup's

Vettel explains Maris family's desire to change focus of Roger Maris's legacy

Rotarian of the Day Jon Benson introduced Joel Vettel, the former long-time Fargo police commander and head of the Fargo Park District who is now a spokesperson for Sanford Health and the Roger Maris Cancer Center.

Vettel talked about something new, the first Roger Maris Academy, an initiative to tackle the challenge of getting kids out of poverty. "The Maris family wants to change the focus of Roger's legacy from baseball to their work with the Cancer Center," he told the group. That now extends beyond the lifesaving care patients receive in the hospital facility in downtown Fargo.

The Roger Maris Academy first identified 30 kids with the help of the Boys and Girls Club. "We want to help them find a purpose in life," he said, adding, "I can relate to that, growing up as one of nine children raised by a single parent."

The academy, launched earlier this year, exposes to young people to a variety of careers via visits to a varied series of workplaces arranged with the help of the Fargo Moorhead West Fargo Chamber of Commerce, and starting with Sanford itself. "Most of these kids won't be doctors," he conceded. "We want to expose them to realistic jobs and realistic positions in health care and in the trades, jobs they can get an education for right here in the community."

He said the Maris program was initially planned for three years, but now is being expanded with the support of the Sanford Foundation. The Teigen family has given a substantial gift to the program to benefit kids who play youth football. With that gift, the Teigen Academy is being planned as a two-week program immediately before the start of the football season. "It will cover things that aren't taught elsewhere," Vettel said, citing money management, how to change a tire or a car's oil, how to tie a tie for job interviews and how to be interviewed.

Plans also include a Sportsman's Summit to discuss all aspects of good sportsmanship. "What should sports be about?" he asked. "Are we going in the right direction? This will be a big event next spring."

He concluded, "Can we change just one kid, one school, one community? We are going to try."
