Moorhead native Ben Dille talks of U.S. State Department talks about Afghanistan

Acting president Jerry Rogers welcomed members Tuesday and introduced Brent Brandt's guest, Scot Hagen of the Moorhead Massage Academy.

Following a recording of the national anthem sung by a Navajo woman in her language, Russ Hanson announced that all of the dictionaries purchased by the club have been distributed to every third grader in Moorhead, Dilworth, Glyndon, Hawley and Barnesville. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, members could not present them individually in the classroom; instead, they were delivered to schools and handed out by teachers. The books include an insert this year explaining a little about Rotary. "We've heard from many teachers about how much they appreciate the dictionaries and use them in their classrooms." he said.

Many of the books purchased through the Cultural Literacy Project, the centennial project funded jointly by the club and a grant from District 5580, have arrived. Members took part in presentations on Thursday and Friday at S.G. Reinertson, Dorothy Dodds and Robert Asp Elementary Schools and Horizon West. Another opportunity to participate will come up when the final shipment to Ellen Hopkins Elementary arrives.

Travel Raffle chair Dale Hetland reminded members that the tickets they've sold (or not sold) must be returned by Tuesday, Oct. 19. Prizes were announced for those who have sold eight or more. About 40 tickets — \$4,000 in value — remain to be sold in the final week. Violet Deilke suggested members check past sales and former Rotarians for prospects.

Ben Dille tells of service in Afghanistan

Rotarian of the Day Teresa introduced Ben Dille, a Moorhead native who has spent 30 years with the U.S. State Department, most recently in Afghanistan. With the embassy in Kabul closed, he is presently posted to Washington, D.C., awaiting a new assignment.

Ben is a member of the Senior Foreign Service with the rank of minister counselor for management affairs. He assumed the position in Kabul in 2020; before that, he was executive director of the Bureau of African Affairs and was sent as charge d'affaires to Khartoum and Freetown. He joined the diplomatic service in 1991 and has also served in Managua, Shanghai, Mexico City and Caracas. He holds a BA from Macalester College, a JD from the University of Minnesota, an LLM from Exeter University on a Rotary scholarship, and a PhD in international and comparative law from the London School of Economics.

Dille was in charge of a large community in Afghanistan, including police, firefighters, apartments and many who lived in industrial





containers. Knowing that withdrawal was planned in the near future, he said all assets had been identified, among them, 500 fully armored vehicles in the compound in the international zone. At the time of his arrival, 5,000 employees were on the books, half of them locals. Of the American contingent, two-thirds worked in security.

Initially, he said, they thought they might leave at Christmas, then after the inauguration, and finally by Sept. 11. That changed. Much of the military was gone by July, which changed exit plans in many ways. In April the consular service told all Americans to go home.

By the end of July, the Taliban was rapidly advancing. Once the determination was made to get out, 1,500 embassy staff were moved in 24 hours by six helicopters, accompanied by 200 troops and the embassy's own security. Ben said he believes he was on the final helicopter to the airport Sunday night. On Monday, one of the final days of the evacuation, he was flown out of Hamid Karzai International Airport on a C-17 cargo plane.
